## No. 352.—NEW ZEALAND—NORTH ISLAND.

*Manukau Harbour—Decreased Depth in South Channel.*

THE Government of New Zealand has given notice, dated 20th April, 1897, that Heron Spit has extended to the south-eastward, and the depth in its vicinity, with the leading beacons for South Channel in line, is not more than two fathoms at low water springs.

Vessels of 12 feet draught and upwards should therefore not attempt to enter the South Channel until three-quarters flood.

Approximate position, Heron Spit, latitude  $37^{\circ} 6' S.$ , longitude  $174^{\circ} 32\frac{1}{4}' E.$

## No. 353.—NORWAY—SOUTH COAST.

*Songvaar Fiord—Rock in Kusvig Fiord.*

THE Norwegian Government has given notice, dated May, 1897, of the existence of a rock, which dries, situated in Kusvig Fiord, in approximately lat.  $58^{\circ} 4' 15'' N.$ , long.  $7^{\circ} 51' 10'' E.$

The danger line, previously shown round the foul ground extending from the eastern shore of Kusvig Fiord, has been drawn on the chart to include the above rock.

## No. 354.—GULF OF MEXICO.

*Bay of Campeche—Light at Champoton.*

INFORMATION has been received that a fixed white light, elevated 52 feet above high water, and visible from a distance of 10 miles in clear weather, has been exhibited from a wooden frame on an old rampart, situated on the south side of the entrance to River Champoton.

*Cheruchup Bay—Sunken Rock Westward of Jumangin Shoal.*

THE Netherlands Government has given notice, dated 12th June, 1897, of the existence of a rock, with a depth of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms on it, and 8 fathoms immediately around, situated in Cheruchup Bay, west coast of Billiton Island, in a position with the summit of Kelmanbang bearing N.  $72^{\circ} E.$ , distant  $8\frac{1}{2}$  cables; and Tikus Island S.  $10^{\circ} E.$

Approximate position, on Chart No. 2137, lat.  $2^{\circ} 47' 0'' S.$ , long.  $107^{\circ} 31' 30'' E.$

The white buoy, surmounted by staff and ball, previously marking Jumangin Shoal, has been moved to the westward of the above rock, and is moored in a depth of 6 fathoms.
