And whereas by certain of such Orders Regulations were prescribed with regard to the

Apprenticeship of Pauper Children:

And whereas it is expedient that, so far as regards the said Parish, further provision should

be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby alter the said Orders so far as regards the said Parish, so as to provide that We may assent, in any case where it may seem to Us necessary or expedient, to a departure from any of the Regulations contained in the said Orders with regard to the Apprenticeship of Pauper Children.
