### To Her Most Gracious Majesty QUEEN VICTORIA.

WE, the general body of Protestant Dissenting Ministers of the three Denominations, Presby-terian, Independent, and Baptist, residing in and about the Cities of London and Westminster, approach the Throne on the auspicious occasion of the completion of the Sixtieth Year of Your Majesty's Reign with respectful assurance of profound loyalty and with humble and heartfelt congratulations.

On Your Majesty's accession to the throne the general body to which we belong had the privilege of approaching Your Majesty when they offered their sincere congratulations and united in the many prayers presented to Almighty God, the Supreme Ruler of men, that he would vouchsafe all needed grace, wisdom, and strength for the discharge of the manifold duties that would devolve upon You through all the changes of the future.

We rejoice in recognizing that these prayers have been answered, and that God has blessed Your Majesty and the people You have been called to govern with an unparalleled measure of benediction during the Sixty Years of Your beneficent reign.

We look in vain in history for a period of equal progress in literature, art, science, and commerce.

Their application to human welfare has been experienced in every grade of society, especially in the humbler walks of life.

The spread of education amongst the people has also been a marked feature of Your Majesty's Reign. In every part of Your Majesty's dominions, too, Your subjects find their condition better and happier to-day than it was sixty years ago. We are pleased to recognize that Your Majesty's

rule has been one of settled government where "Freedom broadens slowly down from precedent to precedent." To a far larger proportion of Your subjects than before Your accession there has been granted a voice in the framing of the laws

by which they are governed, and hence has arisen, we believe, a greater respect for law and order. This with the consequent growth of that sturdy love of liberty which has ever marked the people who rejoice in Your Majesty's rule, has united them to Your Throne in a bond of love such as no other monarch has ever enjoyed.

Your Majesty's most gracious reply to our body when it approached You at Your accession was I shall always respect the rights of conscience."

This assurance has never been forgotten by Your Majesty ; so that we are able to rejoice with exceeding joy in the great advance made in religious liberty during Your long Reign. Your Majesty has given a ready assent to all the measures of increased Religious Equality which have been approved by Parliament.

We are specially glad that we can congratulate Your Majesty, that amongst all classes of Your subjects, and in all the institutions of our country, there is an increased and growing regard for the principles of true and vital religion.

As we thus rejoice on account of the unparalleled blessings which have come to the nation during Your Majesty's Reign we earnestly pray for still more abundant prosperity during Your remaining years. May these years be many, and may they bring much personal comfort and happiness to Your Majesty, and all the Members of Your Royal House.

And when Your Majesty is called upon to lay aside the earthly crown which You have so long and so worthily worn, may it be Yours to receive "the Crown of Life that fadeth not away.

To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

WE, Your Majesty's loyal subjects, the body of English Presbyterian Ministers in and near the Cities of London and Westminster, rejoice to avail ourselves of the special privilege of separate access to the Throne, which, having been granted more than two hundred years ago was disused for a while early in the present century, and then first exercised again in tendering our homage and congratulations on Your Majesty's accession. To no one present then and now can the intervening sixty years dim the interest of that memorable scene of promise. Its hopes have long become realized memories; and a loyalty, then waiting for the confirmation of experience, has set into a habit assured and trustful. In Your Majesty's rule over an eminently domestic people there is a pathetic fitness; their hearts are deeply touched by sorrows that do not spare the Royal House; and rarely do conspicuous strokes of private calamity escape the keen eye of Your Majesty's compassion, or fail to draw forth prompt messages of sympathy and help.

Apart from these claims on personal affection, Your Majesty' Reign has witnessed an impressive development of responsible citizenship at home, and a remarkable expansion of the national life abroad from insular to imperial. By various measures for extending and improving elementary education, by the opening of the older Universities to all Your Majesty's subjects without distinction of creed, by successive steps in the progress of social, municipal, and commercial freedom, by the advance of civil and religious liberty, Your Majesty's Reign is rendered unique not only for the years which it covers, but better still, for its and far-reaching results. beneficent Your Majesty's Sovereignty, it is true, extends to many a dependency, colonial and foreign, less happy than these home islands.

But so sure is the effect of just and beneficent rule, that not one of these components of our "Greater Britain" would accept back its condition of sixty years ago. British ships were the first to watch the seas and baffle the guilty slave trade, heralding the greater act by which, in 1834, the Nation redeemed the bondsmen it had wronged, and pre-engaged the first years of the new reign in repeated measures for their education and citizenship.

Among the many involuntary testimonies to the wisdom and justice of Your Majesty's Reign, none is more impressive than the way in which our fellow subjects in the Colonies unite loyal attachment to Your Majesty's Person and confidence in the equity of Your rule with the free development of their own resources and institutions. The magnificent result thus produced becomes apparent, as we remember that of the vast multitudes of Your Majesty's loyal subjects the inhabitants of these home islands form but a tenth part.

That, sustained by the devotion of Your people, rich in the love of children and children's children, and crowned by the perfect peace of God, Your Majesty may spend the years still vouchsafed, is

the heartfelt prayer of Your grateful and venerating servants.

From a Meeting representing the Religious Society of Friends in Great Britain held in London, the 7th day of the 5th month called May, 1897.

To VICTORIA, QUEEN of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Dominions thereunto belonging :--

May it please the Queen,

IT is with thanksgiving to our Heavenly Father that we approach Thee, our beloved Sovereign, with the expression of loyal and respectful congratulation on the completion of the Sixtieth Year of a Reign extending beyond that either of Thy venerable Grandfather, or of any other of Thy predecessors on the English Throne.

Marked as Thy experience was by the hallowed joys of more than 20 years of unbroken domestic happiness, crowned with the divinely ordered blessing of children and children's children, it has pleased the Lord to prove Thee by many tokens of His chastening love. The death in the prime of life of Thy devoted husband was a bereavement which, whilst seeming for the time almost overwhelming, has been a means in the Lord's overruling goodness of binding Thee to the hearts of all classes of Thy people in the bond of ever deepening sympathy and love.

Occupying Thy exalted position at a period marked by agitation in other parts of Europe, in India and in America, and nearer home, by the terrible famine in Ireland, Thy reign, in the gracious providence of our Heavenly Father, has been one of steady progress to the nation, and of mercies more than can be numbered.

Whilst we would in a spirit, we trust, of Christian humility, mingle our words of congratulation with those of unfeigned regret that war should have so often disturbed a reign otherwise marked by so much blessing, we have thankfully remembered that it was with Thy own hand Thou wast pleased to commend to Thy subjects as a fitting motto for the Jubilee Year the Angelic anthem announcing the Saviour's reign, "Peace on earth, goodwill toward men."

reign, "Peace on earth, goodwill toward men." We have learned with great satisfaction that thy Government has taken the initiative in preparing a measure for the settlement by arbitration of all differences between this country and the United States of America.

In the dark cloud which now, we trust only for a time, overshadows Thy Indian Empire, the sufferings of so many millions of our faminestricken fellow subjects justly claim our deepest sympathy. Whilst hailing with satisfaction the vigorous measures adopted for their relief, we would express our warm desire that this afflictive dispensation may serve afresh impressively to remind us of the solemn obligation, inseparable from our assumption of the Empire of India, for the firm and unflinching maintenance of a wise and Christian policy in all our relations to our fellow subjects throughout that vast dependency.

Looking to the enormous increase which has taken place within Thy Reign in the possessions and influence of this Country throughout the World, we are cheered by the persuasion that it is Thy earnest desire that this great stewardship of influence may ever be exerted in the maintenance of equal right and justice, towards all the peoples and races within Thy vast dominions; and that the simple Christianity of our Lord Jesus Christ presented to us in Holy Scripture as the only foundation for the welfare either of individuals or of nations, may ever continue to be the stability of Thy Throne, and to guide and control the acts of Thy Government.

That Thou, our Beloved Sovereign, mayst be spared for years to come, to exercise Thy benefi-cent Rule over Thy widely extended dominions : and that when Thy earthly service shall have been fulfilled, Thou mayst, in the Lord's unmerited mercy, be permitted through His redeeming grace to enter with acceptance into His immediate Presence to serve Him without weariness, and with everlasting praise, is the fervent prayer of Thy loyal and faithful subjects.



### May it please Your Majesty,

WE, the Presidents, Chairman, Executive, and Members of the Church of England Temperance Society, desire to approach Your Majesty with the expression of our hearty congratulations on the completion of Sixty Years of Your Reign, and of thankfulness for all the blessings which have followed upon Your Majesty's beneficent Rule.

Among these, not the least conspicuous has been the waking up of the nation to a sense of the reproach brought upon it by the existence of a great national vice—that of intemperance—and to sympathy with the efforts which have been made to put an end to it.

It is now 22 years since, armed with the sanction of the then Primate, and in the full recognition of the acc-pted truth that "the Queen's name is a tower of strength," we addressed to Your Majesty a petition that You would become the Patron of the associated work on which, under the name of the Church of England Temperance Society, the Church had embarked.

In acceding to this You were pleased to say that Your consent was given on the understanding that the Society "was organized upon a basis which includes all who advocate temperauce, without insisting necessarily on total abstinence."

The words were an exact expression of the principles upon which our whole work was based; not, indeed, as necessitating any surrender of that advocacy of total abstinence, in which for more than 10 years our founders had been engaged, but as leaving the adoption of the practice to every man's Christian discretion; while for those who in the exercise of that discretion did not see the need for this abridgment of their liberty a common platform was provided, in the formation of Bands of Hope, in the preparation of legislative enactments, and the reformation social customs.

It has been to the faithful carrying out of these principles that the growth of the Society-till its borders have become commensurate with those of the Church itself-must be referred. It is to this that it is due-that pulpits of the Church have been freely opened to us which had been previously closed; to this, that the organization has extended itself to the sister Churches of Ireland and America, and in great measure to the Colonial Churches throughout the Empire ; to this, that a variety of subsidiary agencies—such as the Police Court Mission, the Women's Union, the Church of England Temperance Benefit Society (for men, women, and children), the Army and Railway Associations, the Van Mission. the United Committee for Rescuing the Heathen Lands from that traffic in intoxicants which, in the name of commerce, had been forced upon them-have come into being ; to this, and to kindred efforts, that a public opinion is forming, slowly but surely, which shall give to England the place of leadership in Temperance Reformation.

For this success, our thanks are primarily due to Him by Whom "kings reign and princes decree justice;" but not forgetting the part which He has assigned to Your Majesty as the crowned leader and commander of the people in the greatest Empire that the world has yet known, we can only see in the event of to-day a fulfilment of the twofold promise made to the Church of old through the mouth of the Psalmist, "I will" deliver him and bring him to honour," "with long life will I satisfy him, and will show him My salvation" (Psalm xci, 16): and we pray that as it has been in Your Majesty's life so it may be in that of our kings and queens "to be," that length of days may be asked for and received, only as lengthened opportunities of service to the King of Kings, and that the life on earth may blend into that which is promised as the reward of faithfulness to earthly trusts - " the King asked life of Thee, and Thou gavest him a long life, even for ever and ever" (Psalm xxi, 4).

The Local Government Act, 1894. THE HALESOWEN AND LYE WAKES.

ORDER of the Local Government Board under the District Auditors Act, 1879 : Assignment of Duties and District (Supplemental):-

Devonshire Audit District.

Rural District of Dulverton.

To Robert Coard Tucker, District Auditor ;---To the Rural District Council of Dulverton ;-And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign

to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 9th day of October, 1879, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said Robert Coard Tucker as a District Auditor, and ordered and prescribed that the District in which he should in future act as Auditor, and which was thereby assigned to him, should be termed "The Devonshire Audit District," and should. until We should otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule to that Order;

And whereas it is prescribed by Article II of the said Order that it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the Guardians and Overseers specified in Nos. (1) and (2) of that Article, as well as the Accounts of the other Authorities (and of their Officers) referred to in Nos. (3) and (4) of that Article in the following terms :-

- "(3.) The several other Authorities for the "time being whose Accounts are or may be " by law subject to be audited by a District "Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas "of whose jurisdiction are for the time being "wholly situated within the said Audit "District.
- "(4.) Such of the said other Authorities whose "Accounts are or may be by law subject to "be so' audited, and whose Districts or the " areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time "being partly situated within the said Audit "District, as We may by Order under Seal " hereafter prescribe."

And whereas the Rural District Council of Dulverton is an Authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and the District of the said Rural District Council is partly situated within the said Audit District :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Robert Coard Tucker to audit the Accounts of the said Rural District Council, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions con-tained in Article III of the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the District of the said Rural District Council shall be deemed to be within the said Devonshire Audit District.
