

within three days after the seizure, or, where such person or owner is known, within two days after the aforesaid notice has been given, the Local Authority may cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Local Authority deem expedient.

(2.) Every dog shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

*General Provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897.*

4. Subject to the provisions of this Order, all the provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897 shall, so far as the same are applicable, continue to apply, during the continuance of this Order, to the Districts and part of a District to which this Order applies.

*Offences.*

5. If any dog is found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person allowing the same to be in or on such public place in contravention of this Order, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Interpretation.*

6. In this Order—

"Disease" means rabies, "diseased" means affected with rabies, and "suspected" means suspected of rabies:

"Public place" includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park garden or pleasure ground, common, uninclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1897.

*Existing Muzzling Regulations of Local Authority.*

7. All Regulations made under any Order of the Board by the Local Authority of any District or part of District mentioned in the Schedule to this Order which provide for the muzzling of dogs, and are in force immediately before the commencement of this Order, shall, as regards any District or part of a District to which this Order for the time being applies, be suspended and cease to apply to such District or part of a District so long as this Order applies thereto.

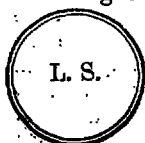
*Commencement.*

8. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

*Short Title.*

9. This Order may be cited as the GLAMORGANSHIRE (MUZZLING OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1897.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

**SPECIAL REGULATIONS** (supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent Notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situations of Assistant Naval Storekeeper, Assistant Victualling Storekeeper, Assistant Cashier, and Assistant Expense Accounts Officer in Her Majesty's Naval Establishments at Home and Abroad.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 18 and 20, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

2. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English Composition, including Précis Writing.

2. Arithmetic.

3. Mathematics, viz. :—Algebra, up to and including the Binomial Theorem; Euclid, Books I to IV and VI; Plane Trigonometry, up to and including the solution of triangles.

4. English History.

5. Latin.

6. French.

7. German.

8. Greek.

9. Chemistry (Inorganic).

10. Physics (Electricity, Magnetism, Heat, Light, and Sound).

Candidates must pass in Subjects 1 and 2, and may select five, but not more than five, of the remaining Subjects. Of the Subjects so selected two at least must be languages (Subjects 5-8).

3. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

4. A fee of £6 will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.
