Marine Sanitary Ordinance, No. 6.

Taking into consideration, &c., it is decreed:—

Decree.

ART. 1. Raw dried hides are no longer to be included among goods whose importation from places infected with the Bubonic Plague is prohibited, and they may be freely introduced into the Kingdom.

ART. 2. Sentence C, of Article 4, of the Marine Sanitary Ordinance No. 3, of May 8th, 1897, and Article 2 of the similar Ordinance of the same date, No. 4, are modified in this sense.
