ORDER of the Local Government Board: Maintenance of Lunatics in Workhouse under Section 26 (1) of the Lunacy Act, 1890: -Mildenhall Uniou.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Mildenhall Union ;

To the Visiting Committee of the Suffolk County Lunatic Asylum, situate at Melton, near Woodbridge ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 26 of the Lunacy Act, 1890, it is enacted that-

"The visitors of any asylum may, with the consent of the Local Government Board and "the Commissioners, and subject to such "regulations as they respectively prescribe, "make arrangements with the guardians of "any union for the reception into the work-"house of any chronic lunatics, not being "dangerous, who are in the asylum and have "been selected and certified by the manager " of the asylum as proper to be removed to "the workhouse"

And whereas the Visiting Committee of the Suffolk County Lunatic Asylum, situate at Melton, in the county of East Suffolk, propose, with the consent of the Local Government Board and of the Commissioners in Lunacy, to make arrangements with the Guardians of the Poor of the said Mildenhall Union for the reception into their Workhouse, situate at Mildenhall, in the county of West Suffolk, of a certain number of chronic female lunatics, not being dangerous, who are now, or may hereafter be, inmates of the said Asylum, and who have been, or may hereafter he, selected and certified by the Manager of the said Asylum as proper to be removed to the said Workhouse; Act, 1890.

No. 26881.

And whereas the Commissioners in Lunacy have prescribed Regulations in accordance with the above-cited enactment with regard to the reception and treatment in the said Workhouse of chronic female lunatics as aforesaid from the said Asylum not exceeding twelve in number, or of such smaller number as shall, with the lunatics chargeable to the said Union and being inmates of the said Workhouse, make the total number of lunatics in the Lunatic Ward of the said Worknot more than sixteen;

And whereas by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Mildenhall Union, amongst others, the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Regulations for the government of the Workhouse of that Union, and by another General Order dated the 14th day of January, 1867, the Poor Law Board prescribed the mode of keeping the Accounts relating to such Workhouse;

And whereas it is expedient that We, the Local Government Board, should prescribe further Regulations in connection with the reception into the said Workhouse of chronic female lunatics as aforesaid, hereinafter termed "patients," from the said County Lunatic Asylum:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :-

ARTICLE I.—No patient shall be admitted to the said Workhouse either upon her first or any subsequent admission without a written or printed Order signed by the Manager or Medical Superintendent of the said Asylum. Such written or printed Order shall be according to the Form in the Schedule to this Order.

ARTICLE II .- The patients shall be classified in such manner as the Guardians, with the advice of the Medical Officer of the Workhouse, shall

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians, acting under the advice of the Medical Officer of the Workhouse, may cause any patient to be returned to the said Asylum when they shall consider that it is expedient that she should not continue in the said Workhouse.

ARTICLE IV .- The Master of the Workhouse shall give to the Manager or Medical Superintendent of the said Asylum not less than seventytwo hours' notice of the proposed return of any patient to the said Asylum as aforesaid.

ARTICLE V .- The Master of the Workhouse shall keep a separate Admission and Discharge Book with respect to the patients received into the said Workhouse from the said Asylum.

ARTICLE VI .- The Guardians shall cause Accounts to be opened and entries to be made, in such form as We may approve, in their Books of Account and in the Financial Statements to be submitted to the District Auditor, so that the costs and expenses incurred in respect of the maintenance and care of the said patients may be distinguished from the expenses of a like sort in regard to the other inmates of the said Workhouse.

ARTICLE VII.—Subject to the foregoing regulations and the regulations of the Commissioners in Lunacy above referred to, every patient received into the said Workhouse shall be amenable to the Regulations in force respecting the government of the said Workhouse.

ARTICLE VIII .- Expressions in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the Lunacy

Altering General Accounts Order: Appointment
of Stocktaker:—

Festiniog Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Festiniog Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Festiniog Union (amongst others), it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store:

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the

other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the said Festiniog Union may, as and when they shall think fit to do so, appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regula-

tions, as to the appointment of Officers, in force in the said Union for the time being.

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians shall pay to the person or persons appointed under this Order such salary or remuneration as We may from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Every person appointed under this Order shall hold office until he shall die, or resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians, subject to Our consent, or be removed by Us, or be proved to be insane by evidence which We may deem sufficient; and the said Guardians shall give notice to Us of every such death or resignation, and state the cause of such resignation, so far as it may be known to them.

Provided nevertheless, that the Guardians may, if they think fit, with Our assent, appoint a person or persons to discharge the duties hereby prescribed for the Stocktaker for a limited period only.

ARTICLE V.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

ARTICLE VI.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article V, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form :-

"Submitted to me this , 18 , and found to be correct as "regards the quantities of stock remaining in 46 store.

" (Signed)

"Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such addition to the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article V, submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE IX.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the above-cited Order dated the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixtyseven.
