THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by "The Public Works Loan Act, 1897," (60-1 Vict., c. 51, s. 1), they are pleased that the rates of interest chargeable on public loans granted subsequently to the passing of that Act, and secured on local rates, shall be fixed according to the following scale, Rates

It is to be observed that the Act contemplates the adoption of higher rates of interest if at any time the Treasury are of opinion that such action is necessary in the interests of the solvency of the Local Loans Fund.

* The Act defines a "local rate" to be "any rate levied or assessed, the proceeds of which are applicable to public local purposes, and which is levied on the basis of a valuation of property, and includes any sum which, though obtained in the first instance by a precept, certificate, or other instrument requiring payment for some authority or officer, is or can be ultimately raised out of a rate as before defined."

† 23 per cent. is the lowest rate of interest allowed by the Act.
