Constantinople, July 4.

Ti Till E Grand Vilier perceiving Saltan Solyman's liness of a Dropsey enercised daily, informach that the Phyticians were or opinion he wall to live long, resolved before he went into the field for fettle Matters here, as that his Brother Achmet should facced him; accordingly he cailed together the Musti, the Cadilesquer, the Caimacan, and the Chief Persons of the Law, to consuit with them about it; the Musti and some others, readily declared themselves for Achmet, youngest Son of Sultan Ibrahim, but the major part rejected him, as unsit for Government, having been kept a Prisonstrever since he was 5 years old, and proposed Mastaphia, the Son of the lare Sultan Makomer. The Virier caused the Musti to discourse with them afterwards in private, and to endeavour to bring them off from their Resolution in favour of Mustaphia, but they persisting therein, the thief of them, with some old Officers of the Janisaries, were banished to Rhodes, Cyprus, and Lemmos, which so terrified the rest, that they durit not oppose any longer the Viser's design; Who, at his departure for Adrianeple, took with him the sick Sultan, Mahomet, and Mustaphia, and after having let the Army rest there 4 days, that there might be no Commotions among them upon the Sultan's death marched to Philippopoli. On the 22d of June Sultan Salyman dyed, and the some day Suitan Achmet was Prochamed at Adrianeple, and on the 25th here, and at Galeta. The Electron of Bavaria is studdenly expected, and so soon as he arrives its believed we shall enter upon some considerable Action. The French, since their repassing the Po, continue encamped about Piobes. They are still at work to undermine the Pottssections, of Carmagnole, but at the same time show as design of quitting that place till they be forced to it. Milan, August 8. Our Governor has ordered all the Sosses in this State, and the Troops that are now possed at Noverre, to march forthwith to Piedmons; And intends to block up Casal towards Winter.

Vence, August 10. A Convoy of 18 Ships lies ready to fill with the first fair Wind, with which the Baron de December, General of our Land Forces, will pass to the Levant with 800 Soldiers and 200000 Ducats. We have received no news from our Fiect since that of their being silled towards the Archipelago.

Vienna, August 12. The Letters from the Imperial Camp at Peter Warzain of the 2d initiant give an account that the whole Octoman Army had passed the Save and the Basses, and were daily expedied in the Turkish Camp; That the Enemy had fent to Sincist up the Danube, to see some Men ashore near Peter Waraain, who sined upon our Our-Guard, but presently recired, and to prevent the like for the surve, Prince Law had ordered 12 Pieces of Cannon to be planted on the Basses of the Danube; that he had likewise given Orders for the fortifying of Peter Warain, and laying a Bridge of Botts over the Danube, in order to maintain a Comone banks of the Danube; that he had likewise given Orders for the fortifying of Peter Wintalin, and laying a Bridge of Bits over the Danube, in order to maintain a Communication with Upper Hangary and Transferdama; That the Turkish Chiaus was kindly received and treated by Prince Lewis, and sent back on the 30th past; And that Complaint had been made to the Grand Visier, of the Vio-

brion of the Articles granted to the Guisson of Titul, who feemed much offended as it, and promified to publish these that were guilty thereof, and to release as many German Prisoners as were killed of the Garison. From Transivativativa they write of the zeit path that General Viermi marched on the 26th with the Troops under his constand to Winz, and on the 28th to Polamir, up in advice that the Enemy had pussed the Porta Fire, a die is a design to invade that Principality, but it proved a mittake occasioned by the march of a Body of Turks to Carisson. This day are come in Letters of the 4th instant from the imperial Camp, which say, that the Army, after having oven reinforced at Peter Winstain by 2000 Brythian and the Regiment of Bielke, marched from thence on the 3d, and encamped within 2 Leagues of Salankement, that I transit the Caristo of the Save; That the Turks had undermined the Castle of Tital in order to blow it up, in case any of our Troops were sent to retake it; And that our Army was to march on the 5th to Silankement. The Croats have taken Novi on the River Unua, putting the Garison with the Commandant and 4 Aga's to the Sword. Secretary Capelle is arrived here from Vineae, and is to go with an Envey that's expected from Peland to the Imperial Camp, to atsild at the Treaty of Peace with the Truks.

From the Elector of Saxony's Comp at Breshaym, August 16. On the 10th instant we muched from Seckin-heym to Swetzingen, at the fame time the Bridge was taken away from Mankern, and the Provisions that were laid up there removed to Ladinburg. On the 11th we marched to Wifelech, and having received advice that the French had taken the Town of Privatharm, in which there was a Garison of 200 Men, who were made Prisoners of War, we advanced towards this piace, with a resolution to march on towards the Enemy, but some after our arrival here we understood, that up in notice of our march they had abandoned Prisoners, and were retired towards Bruchfall. On the 12th and 13th several Parties were sent our, who took some Prisoners. The 14th we marched nearer to Bretheym; The Enemy appeared with strong Detachements in tight of our Vaa-Guard, but durift not attempt any thing.

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Hydelbergh, August 13. The Garison of Landau, except only two Battalions which continue there, have passed the Rhine at Philipsburgh, in order to joyn the French Army under the command of the Mireschal de Lorge, who lyes now between Pfortzheim and Dwinch. Dike Friderick of Sane Gotha dyed on the 12th instant at Eysensch of an Apoplexy.

Francfort, August 19. Three thousand Suedes are arrived in our Neighbourhood, and to morrow they will pass the Main at Steinheim, and thence continue their match to joyn the Confederate Army in the Palitinare.

Hamburgh, August 20. The Letters from Foland say, that the Army of that Crown was decamped and marched towards the remotiers of Podolia.

Colegne, Aug. 21. The Forces of Neubourg, under the command of the Count d'Aurel, are still encamped near Gerolstein, expéding a Reinforcement from Juliers, Duscidorp, and other Garisons, and a great quantry of Armannition, Bombs, &c. from this place. In the mean time their Parties make Excussions as far as Himmerath, Moeifbach, and Cusson, on the other tide of the Moselle, without meeting any of the Enemies Troops. The strench have at present in Hontropa, but 100 Dragoons and 300 Foot. By the Letters of the 18th from the Palatinate we have an account, that 900 Saxons and Hustins having been fent out on the 14th to observe the Enemy, were come back that day, having met with and cut in pieces about 500 French, and taken a great many Prilipers. The French are retired from Psortabelmaster having committed there the most barbarous Cruelties.

Manjeilles, August 10. On the 6th instant arrived here a Vessel, who came with the French squaron commanded by the Count a' Especa far as the lues of Heres, troop whence the Men of War are to return to Teslon, and sing Galleys Hither; They have been before Atania, and done some damage to that place with their Bombs, but upon the appearance of 17 Spanish Men of War and 3 Fireships on the 29th past, the Stench retired and 10006.

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
