of August 1897 under the powers conferred upon them by section 46 of "The Tramways Act 1870" make the following Bye-laws and Regulations :-

Borough of Dover. Tramways. Bye-Laws and Regulations, made by the Corporation of Dover as the Local Authority and as promoters of the tramways under section 46 of "The Tramways Act, 1870."

THE Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Dover, acting by the Council as the Local Authority of the said borough, under "The Tramways Act, 1×70," do hereby with respect to the tramways laid down within the said borough, and in pursuance of the power for that purpose contained in the said Act, make the Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter contained.

· As · Local Authority as 'to the following. matters:-

The rate of speed to be observed in travelling

The distances at which carriages using the tramway shall be allowed to follow one after the

The stopping of carriages using the tramway. The traffic on the road in which the tramway is laid.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any machine engine or carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a machine engine, or car, and the term "person" shall include any body of

persons, whether corporate or unincorporate.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than four miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding

eight miles an hour.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a

less distance than 100 yards.

- 4. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 3 and 5, every driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same, except on a gradient steeper than 1 in 25, for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers in the course of its journey, when required so to do by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made.
- 5. Except at a passing place or a terminus no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads.
- 6. Every driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road without there being sufficient free space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.
- 7. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.
- 8. No carriage shall be stopped for the purpose of delivering any goods or parcels except at such places or at such distances as the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses may from time to time appoint or direct.

And as Promoters as to the following matters:-For preventing the commission of any nuisance in or upon any carriage, or in or against any premises belonging to them.

For regulating the travelling in or upon any

carriage belonging to them.

9. Every passenger shall enter or depart from the inside or outside of a car by the conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

10. No passenger shall smoke inside any car or on either platform.

11. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

- 12. A person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any infectious or contagious disease, shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any car, and if found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 12. No person shall swear or use any obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

14. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number, plate, printed, painted or other notice, or any advertisement in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car, or touch, handle, or interfere with any electric machine or appliance in, under, upon, or about any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

15. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats, linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car, and shall not enter, or be or remain in or upon any part thereof, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any car, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

16. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer the fare legally demandable for the journey.

17. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized officer, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

18. A passenger not being an artizan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the said Tramways Order, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artizans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

19. Personal luggage not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight (including the tools of artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers) may be carried by hand, or, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, shall be placed on the front or driver's platform. conductor may decline to take into or upon the car any luggage of a form or description to annoy or inconvenience any passenger.

20. No passenger or other person not being an authorized officer shall be permitted to travel on the steps of any car or to travel on the platform of any car where suitable fixed seats are not provided on such platform, or to travel on any platform occupied by the driver of any car whether seats shall or shall not be provided on such lastmentioned platform, or to stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any car, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

21. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, or an authorized officer, shall enter or mount any car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any car, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

22. When any car contains the full number of passengers which may lawfully be conveyed thereby no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such car, when warned by the conductor not to do so, and the conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond that number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a car.

23. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any car whilst

in motion.

24. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of any car nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal is offensive or an annoyance to any passenger shall the same be allowed on the outside of any car. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor or any passenger. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

25. No person shall enter, get upon, or travel in or on any car with loaded fire-arms, or with any article, instrument, or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

26. No person shall wiifully obstruct or impede any authorized officer in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

27. The conductor of each car shall enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations, and prevent any breach thereof to the best of his ability.

28. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of forty shillings; provided nevertheless that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made, or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence, may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment as a penalty of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty imposed by these Bye-laws and Regulations.

29. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use and in every office and waiting room a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

30. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come in force on the 1st day of November, 1897.
