

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Warrington and Wirrall Unions;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Unions;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 16th day of June, 1897, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said John Frederick Adams as a District Auditor, and directed that the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which should be termed "The North-Western Counties Audit District," should, until We should otherwise prescribe, comprise, among other areas, the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule B to the said Order, including the Wirrall Union, and the Rural District of Wirrall, such District being then partly within the said Audit District;

And whereas the said Warrington Union is included in the South-West Lancashire Audit District, and Charles Frederick Jordison is the Auditor for that District;

And whereas it is expedient that the said Wirrall Union should be separated from the North-Western Counties Audit District and that the said Warrington Union should be added to such Audit District:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The said Order dated the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, shall be altered by the name of the Warrington Union being inserted in Schedule B to that Order in place of the name of the Wirrall Union.

ARTICLE II.—From and after the date of this Order, the said Rural District of Wirrall shall cease to be within the said North-Western Counties Audit District, and it shall cease to be the duty of the said John Frederick Adams to audit the accounts of the Rural District Council for that Rural District and of the Officers of such Rural District Council.

ARTICLE III.—Nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the duties and powers of the said John Frederick Adams or Charles Frederick Jordison, or any Assistant District Auditor, as regards any Audit which, before the issue of this Order, may have been commenced or held by either of them, or of which either of them may have given notice, or as regards any proceedings arising out of any such Audit.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 1ST OCTOBER 1897.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The sale or exposure for sale of any swine in or at J. Swan and Sons' sale-yard in the burgh of Perth is hereby prohibited.

2. If a pig is sold or exposed for sale in or at the said sale-yard at Perth in contravention of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier thereof, and the owner or consignee of each pig so sold or exposed, and the person so selling or exposing the same, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale at such sale-yard, and the purchaser thereof of any pig so sold or exposed in contravention of this Order such purchaser knowing the pig to be sold or exposed for sale in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 2ND OCTOBER 1897.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked, and the Order dated the eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven prohibiting the holding of markets and fairs and of public and other sales or exhibitions of swine, fat or store, within the parishes of St. Clears and Llanfihangel-Aber-Cowin in the county of Carmarthen, shall be read and have effect as if the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight were substituted for the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven in Article 3 of the last-mentioned Order, as the date upon which that Order shall come into operation.
