In the Matter of the Cottonwood Water Power and Electric Company, Limited.

At an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Members of the above-named Company, duly convened, and held at 297, Winchester House, Old Broad-street, on the 24th day of September, 1897, the following Extraordinary Resolution was duly passed:—
