The Liverpool Waterloo Hotel Company Limited Special Resolution. Passed 13th September, 1897. Confirmed 30th September, 1897.

At an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Liverpool Waterloo Hotel Company Limited, duly convened and held at the registered office of the Company, 2, Cases-street, Liverpool, on the 13th day of September, 1897, the subjoined Special Resolution was duly passed, and at a subsequent Extraordinary General Meeting of the said Company also duly convened and held at the
