ORDERS for the Court's going into Mourning on Thursday, the 28th instant, for Her late Royal Highness The Princess Mary Adelaide, Duchess of Teck, First Cousin to Her Majesty The Queen, viz. :-

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, white Gloves, black or white Shoes, Feathers, and Fans, Pearls, Diamonds, or plain gold or silver Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to wear black Court Dress, with black Swords and Buckles. The Court to change the Mourning on Thursday, the 11th November next, viz. :-

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The Ladies to wear black Dresses, with coloured Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments, or grey or white Dresses, with black Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to continue the same Mourning.

And on Thursday, the 18th November, the Court to go out of Mourning.

Earl Marshal's Order for a General Mourning. IN pursuance of Her Majesty's commands, these are to give public notice, that upon the melancholy occasion of the death of Her late Royal Highness The Princess Mary Adelaide, Duchess of Teck, First Cousin to Her Majesty The Queen, it is expected that all persons do put themselves into Mourning for ten days, to commence this day.
