THE Queen has been graciously pleased to signify Her intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross on the undermentioned Officers, whose claims have been submitted for Her Majesty's approval, for their conspicuous bravery during the operations on the North-West Frontier of India, as recorded against their names :—

Regiment.	Name.	Acts of Courage for which recommended.
Indian Staff Corps	Major and Brevet Lieutenant-Colonel Robert Bellew Adams	During the fighting at Nawa Kili, in Upper Swat, on the 17th August, 1897, Lieutenant-Colonel R. B. Adams proceeded with Lieutenants H. L. S. MacLean and Viscount Fincastle, and five men of the Guides, under a very heavy and close fire, to the rescue of Lieutenant R. T. Greaves, Lancashire Fusiliers, who was lying disabled by a bullet wound and surrounded by the enemy's swordsmen. In bringing him under cover he (Lieutenant Greaves) was struck by a bullet and killed—Lieutenant MacLean was mortally wounded—whilst the horses of Lieutenant-Colonel Adams and Lieutenant Viscount Fincastle were shot, as well as two troop horses.

Indian Staff Corps	Lieutenant Edmond William Costello	On the night of the 26th July, 1897, at the Malakand, Lieutenant Costello went out from the hospital enclosure, and, with the assistance of two sepoys, brought in a wounded Lance-Halvidar who was lying 60 yards away in the open on the football ground. This ground was at the time overrun with swordsmen and swept by a heavy fire both from the enemy and our own men who were holding the sapper lines.

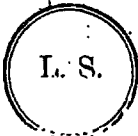

An iron beacon, consisting of a post, surmounted by a framework square, painted red and white in vertical stripes, has been erected on the south-east side of Long Stag reef; in a position with the beacon eastward of Savannah La Mar bearing N. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., distant $1\frac{5}{16}$ miles; and Robins Point N.W. $\frac{3}{8}$ W.

4. A conical buoy, painted red and white in vertical stripes, is moored in a depth of 22 feet on the eastern edge of Outer shoal, in a position with beacon eastward of Savannah La Mar bearing N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., distant $11\frac{1}{4}$ cables; and Robins Point W.N.W.

5. A cubical buoy, surmounted by a pole and globe, painted red and white in horizontal stripes, marks the western edge of a small coral patch, with a least depth of 17 feet on it, and 4 fathoms close around. From the buoy the beacon eastward of Savannah La Mar bears N. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., distant $11\frac{3}{4}$ cables; and Robins Point W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

The spar buoy (red and white in horizontal stripes), previously moored about a cable eastward of this position; and the can buoy (red and

white vertical stripes) nearly 2 cables, N.W. by N., have been withdrawn.

6. An iron beacon, consisting of a post surmounted by a framework square, painted red and white in vertical stripes, has been erected in a depth of 14 feet on the south-east side of Fifty-six Shoal; in a position with beacon eastward of Savannah La Mar bearing N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., distant $8\frac{1}{4}$ cables; and Robins Point W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

The conical buoy (black and white in vertical stripes), previously marking the southern edge of Fifty-six Shoal, has been withdrawn.

7. A large white framework-beacon has been erected in front of the house situated close to the coast in a position bearing W. by N. $\frac{3}{4}$ N., distant $5\frac{1}{4}$ cables, from Savannah La Mar Fort.

The beacon on the shoal, 2 cables, S. by W., from that house has been withdrawn.

Chacachacare (Bocas de Dragos) Light is a third order, dioptric, flashing white light every fifteen seconds, thus:—light, one and three-quarter seconds; eclipse, thirteen and a-quarter seconds; elevated 865 feet above high water, illuminating power 18,000 candles, and visible in clear weather from a distance of about 20 miles.

The lighthouse, 50 feet high, is a concrete tower, coloured white, and situated on the summit above the northern point of the island.
