CEREMONIAL observed at the Funeral of HER LATE ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCESS MARY ADELAIDE WILHELMINA ELIZABETH, DUCHESS OF TECK, First Cousin to HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN, at St. George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, on Wednesday, 3rd November, 1897, at one o'clock.

On the night of Tuesday, 2nd of November, the Remains of Her late Royal Highness The Duchess of Teck, accompanied by The Hon. Arthur Walsh, Comptroller of Her late Royal Highness's Household, and Mr. Adams, the Steward, were privately removed from the White Lodge, Richmond Park, and conveyed to the North Entrance of St. George's Chapel. Here they were received by The Dean and Clergy of Windsor, and deposited temporarily at the West End of the Nave near the Tomb of The Princess Charlotte, where a short service was held.

On the morning of Wednesday, 3rd of November, His Highness The Duke of Teck, with Their Serene Highnesses The Prince and Princess Adolphus and The Prince Alexander of Teck, and accompanied by Their Royal Highnesses The Duchess of Albany and The Duke and Duchess of York, with their Ladies and Gentlemen in Waiting, left White Lodge and travelled by Special Train, South Western Railway, from Mortlake, arriving at the Deanery, Windsor, before 12.30 o'clock, and returned in the afternoon to White Lodge. Their Royal Highnesses were met at Windsor Station by Colonel The Hon. W. Carington, C.B., Equerry to The Queen.

Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, with His Highness The Prince Christian Victor of Schleswig-Holstein, arrived from Cumberland Lodge, and Their Royal Highnesses The Duke and Duchess of Connaught and Strathearn, with their attendants, also arrived from Bagshot, where they returned in the afternoon.

A Special Train, to convey Her Majesty's Invited Guests, left Paddington Station at 11.50 o'clock, and arrived at Windsor at 12.25 o'clock, where carriages were in waiting to convey them to the South Door of the Chapel, from whence they were shewn to seats in the Choir by Her Majesty's Gentlemen Ushers.

At 12.5 o'clock, a Special Train left Paddington Station to convey Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales, and other Members of The Royal Family, to Windsor, arriving at 12.40 o'clock. Major The Hon. H. Legge, M.V.O., Equerry to The Queen, was in attendance at Windsor Station.

Her Royal Highness The Princess of Wales, with the other Princesses who arrived by this train, drove to the Deanery and were there received by

The Vice-Chamberlain.

Her Royal Highness The Princess of Wales, with Her Royal Highness The Duchess of York, and Her Serene Highness The Princess Adolphus of Teck were conducted by The Hon. A. N. Hood, Gentleman Usher to The Queen, to Her

Majesty's Pew with their Ladies and Gentlemen in Attendance.

The following Members of The Royal Family, viz.—Their Royal Highnesses The Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, The Duchess of Connaught and Strathearn, The Duchess of Albany, Her Serene Highness The Princess Victor of Hohenlohe, with Countess Feodora Gleichen, as well as The Lady Geraldine Somerset, representing Her Royal Highness The Grand Duchess of Mecklenburg-Strelitz, The Hon. Lady Biddulph, representing Her Royal Highness The Princess Beatrice, Princess Henry of Battenberg, and The Hon. Mrs. Monson, representing Her Royal Highness The Duchess of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, with their Ladies in Waiting, also drove to the Deanery, and were conducted by The Vice-Chamberlain to seats prepared for them near the Rails of the Altar.

His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., and others taking part in the Procession were on arrival at the South Door, conducted by the Great Officers to the West End of the Chapel to await the commencement of the Funeral Service. They were there joined by His Highness The Chief Mourner accompanied by his supporters, being conducted from the Deanery by The Vice-Chamberlain.

At one o'clock, The Right Rev. The Bishop of Peterborough and The Very Rev. The Dean of Windsor with The Rev. Edgar Sheppard, Sub-Dean of Her Majesty's Chapels Royal, and The Rev. F. S. Colman, Vicar of St. John The Baptist's Church, Kingston Vale, The Canons, The Minor Canons and Choir of St. George's Chapel, proceeded to the West End of the Nave, and a Procession was formed in the following order:—

As the Procession moved up the Chapel a March, by Schubert, was played on the Organ.

On arrival in the Choir the Coronet of Her late Royal Highness was placed on the Coffin by The Hon. Arthur Walsh, Comptroller to Her late Royal Highness.

His Highness The Chief Mourner stood at the head of the Coffin with his Supporters on each side.

The other Royal Personages stood behind them.

The Representatives took their places in the space to the left of the Altar.

The Supporters of the Pall stood on either side of the Coffin and The Lord Chamberlain at the foot.

When the Clergy and Choir had taken their places within the Rails of the Altar the 90th Psalm was chanted.

The Dean of Windsor read the Lesson, after which the Hymn, "Lead, Kindly Light," was sung.

The sentences, music by Croft, were sung by the Choir.

The Bishop of Peterborough then read the sentences "Forasmuch as it has pleased," &c., during which Earth and Flowers were cast on the Coffin by The Hon. Arthur Walsh.

After The Lord's Prayer the Hymn, "My God, my Father, while I Stray,"

was sung.

The Bishop then read the concluding Prayers.

Before the Blessing, the Choir sang the Anthem, "Brother, thou art gone before," music by Sir A. Sullivan.

Norroy King of Arms, acting for Garter King of Arms, then proclaimed

the Style of Her late Royal Highness, as follows:

"Thus it hath pleased Almighty God to take out of this transitory life unto His Divine Mercy the late Most Illustrious Princess Mary Adelaide Wilhelmina Elizabeth, Duchess of Teck, Wife of His Highness Prince Francis Paul Charles Louis Alexander, Duke of Teck, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Major-General of Her Majesty's Forces; Younger Daughter of the late Most Illustrious Prince Adolphus Frederick, Duke of Cambridge, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Field Marshal in the Army; and First Cousin of Her Most Excellent Majesty, Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen Defender of the Faith, Empress of India.

"May God bless and Preserve Her Majesty with long life, health, and honour."

Her Royal Highness The Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein placed upon the Coffin wreaths sent by The Queen.

At the Conclusion of the Service, Chopin's Funeral March was played.

Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales and other Members of The Royal Family proceeded to Windsor Castle, and after luncheon returned to London by a Special Train at 3.15 o'clock.

Luncheon was also served for Her Majesty's Invited Guests at Windsor Castle, after which they returned to London by Special Train at 3 o'clock.

A Guard of Honour of the 2nd Battalion Coldstream Guards was mounted at the South Door of St. George's Chapel.

Minute Guns were fired by a Battery of Royal Horse Artillery stationed in the Long Walk, Windsor Park, whilst the Service was in progress.

Wreaths and Floral Tributes in large numbers sent by Foreign Royal Personages, Absent and Present Members of The Royal Family, as well as by Personal Friends and others, were placed in St. George's Chapel and in the Albert Memorial Chapel adjoining.

A Special Service in Memory of Her late Royal Highness was held in the Chapel Royal, St. James's Palace, at the same hour as the Funeral at Windsor,

at which The Lord Bishop of London (Dean of Her Majesty's Chapels Royal), The Rev. Edgar Sheppard (Sub-Dean of Her Majesty's Chapels Royal), The Venerable the Archdeacon of Huddersfield (Hon. Chaplain in Waiting), and The Rev. H. D. Macnamara (Priest in Ordinary in Waiting), officiated. The Service included the Burial Service, and an Address which was given by The Sub-Dean. The Musical portions were rendered by the full Choir of the Chapel Royal. Dr. Creser presided at the Organ.

Many Members of the Corps Diplomatique attended, and were conducted to their seats in the Royal Pew by The Hon. Richard Moreton, Her Majesty's Marshal of the Ceremonies.

The Hon. Otway Cuffe and Mr. Raglan Somerset, Gentlemen Ushers to The Queen, were in Attendance in the Body of the Chapel, assisted by Mr. Thomas C. March, C.B., Secretary to the Board of Green Cloth, and Colonel Jennings.

No invitations were issued, but a notice was published in the Daily Papers to the effect that admission would be given by Ticket, to be obtained on application to the Sub-Dean of the Chapel Royal, St. James's.
