THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated October 21, from Her Majesty's Representative at Nicaragua, reporting that all vessels arriving at Blewfields from ports in the United States of America, or the Republic of Colombia, or from any other port where yellow fever is known to exist, will, if they bring a clean bill of health, be detained in quarantine for three days. Any vessel not bringing a clean bill of health, or on board of which during her three days' quarantine any case of sickness occurs, will be ordered to immediately leave Nicaraguan waters.
