## NOTICES TO MARINERS.

(Nos. 22 to 31 of the year 1898.)

### No. 22.—CELEBES—SOUTH COAST.

*Sunken Rock South-Westward of Cape Bulu Bulu.*

THE Netherlands Government has given notice that the Master of the Netherlands Indies steam-vessel "Japara" reports the existence of an isolated rock, with a depth of 16 feet on it, situated about one mile off shore, in a position with Malasoro Point in line with Jeneponto Head bearing about W. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.; and Point Petang about N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.

Approximate position, lat.  $5^{\circ} 42' 50''$  S., long.  $119^{\circ} 44' 25''$  E.

### No. 23.—EASTERN ARCHIPELAGO— LOMBOK.

*Light at Ampenan.*

THE Netherlands Government has given notice that, on 5th January, 1898, a sixth order, fixed white light, elevated 41 feet above the sea, and visible 11 miles in clear weather, was shown from a white, framework, iron support, 42 feet in height, with the keeper's dwelling (white, red roof) adjoining, situated in a position bearing N.E. by N., distant 68 yards, from Ampenan Flagstaff, west coast of Lombok.

Approximate position, lat.  $8^{\circ} 34' 15''$  S., long.  $116^{\circ} 3' 55''$  E.

### No. 24.—SCOTLAND—EAST COAST. RIVER FORTH.

(1) *Buoyage above Grangemouth.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 776 of 1897 on alterations in buoyage above Grangemouth:—

Information has been received from the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses that the undermentioned amendments and additions should be made to that Notice:—

a. The red, conical buoy, moored on the northern side of the channel, opposite Grangemouth, has not been withdrawn; and the gas-lighted boat, with a conical superstructure, painted red, and showing an occulting white light every six seconds, is moored near the middle of the river, off Grangemouth, in a position with Grangemouth East Pier Lighthouse bearing S. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., distant 4 cables; and Greendike Northern House W. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.
