Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 26TH JANUARY 1898.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896.

1.—(1.) From and after the commencement of this Order, the provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 dated the eleventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six shall, except as hereinafter provided, apply to the Districts of Local Authorities defined in the Schedule to this Order.

(2.) The said provisions shall not apply to any part of the said Districts which for the time being may be declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Suspected Zone or may be included in any such Zone.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

No. 39.—ENGLAND—EAST COAST.

Sheerness: Mast of Sunken Barge off Garrison Point Removed.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 760 of 1897:—Further information has been received

from the Queen's Harbour Master, Sheerness, dated 13th January, 1898, that the mast of the barge which lies sunk in a position with Garrison Point Lighthouse bearing S.S.E., distant nearly $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables, has been removed, and the wreck is no longer a danger to navigation.

Consequently the wreck-marking vessel and wreck buoy have been withdrawn.

No. 40.—MEDITERRANEAN— ARCHIPELAGO.

Zante Island—Light on Cape Skinari.

THE Hellenic Government has given notice that, on 13th January, 1898, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Cape Skinari, northern point of Zante Island:—

Cape Skinari Light is a third order, dioptric, white flashing light, elevated 218 feet above the sea, 30 feet above the ground, and visible from N. 63° E., through east and south, to N. 47° W. (an arc of 250°), a distance of 20 miles in clear weather.

The lighthouse is a cylindrical tower, of masonry, with the light-keeper's dwelling adjoining it.

Approximate position, lat. $37^{\circ} 56' 5''$ N., long. $20^{\circ} 42' 20''$ E.

Milo—Light on Western Akrathi Island.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 70 of 1897:—

The Hellenic Government has given notice that, on 13th January, 1898, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse erected on the north-west point of the western Akrathi Island, east side of entrance to the Port of Milo:—

Akrathi (Acradies) Light is a fourth order, dioptric, fixed red light, elevated 253 feet above the sea, 23 feet above the ground, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 16 miles.
