TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEES TO BE HELD AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 1ST FEBRUARY 1898.)

KENT (MUZZLING OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1898.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extent and Enforcement.

1. This Order applies to and shall be in force in the Districts and part of a District of Local Authorities mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be enforced by the Local Authority of each such District or part of a District.

Muzzling of Dogs.

2.—(1.) No dog shall be allowed to be in or on any public place unless such dog is efficiently muzzled with a wire cage muzzle so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while wearing the same to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent such dog from breathing freely or lapping water.

(2.) Provided that the provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a.) packs of hounds or greyhounds while being exercised or used for sporting purposes, or other sporting dogs while being used for sporting purposes, or any dogs while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin, and in every case in charge of competent persons.

(b.) dogs while being taken to or from exhibitions, shows, or other places if such dogs are confined in boxes, cages, crates, baskets, or hampers so constructed as to render it impossible for such dogs while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Unmuzzled Dogs.

3.—(1.) Any dog found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed

by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows :

- (i.) If the dog is diseased or suspected or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog it shall be forthwith slaughtered.
- (ii.) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.
- (iii.) In any other case the dog shall be detained in some proper place and be there kept for such period as the Local Authority think expedient : Provided that where the person having charge of or the owner of a dog so detained is known, the Local Authority shall cause notice to be forthwith given to such person or owner of the fact of the dog having been so seized and detained, and the dog shall, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of this Order, be given up to such person or owner on payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such detention. If the dog so seized and detained has not been claimed by such person or owner within three days after the seizure, or, where such person or owner is known, within two days after the aforesaid notice has been given, the Local Authority may cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Local Authority deem expedient.

(2.) Every dog shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

General Provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Order, all the provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897 shall, so far as the same are applicable, continue to apply, during the continuance of this Order, to the Districts and part of a District to which this Order applies.

Offences.

5. If any dog is found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person allowing the same to be in or on such public place in contravention of this Order, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

6. In this Order—

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies :

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park garden or pleasure ground, common, uninclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access :

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1897.

Existing Muzzling Regulations of Local Authority.

7. All Regulations made under any Order of the Board by the Local Authority of any District or part of a District mentioned in the Schedule to

this Order which provide for the muzzling of dogs, and are in force immediately before the commencement of this Order, shall, as regards any District or part of a District to which this Order for the time being applies, be suspended and cease to apply to such District or part of a District so long as this Order applies thereto.

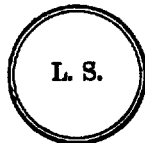
Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

9. This Order may be cited as the KENT (MUZZLING OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1898.

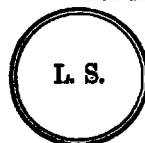

No. 50.—CHILE.

Arauco Bay Approach—Particulars of Dangers in Boca Chica.

THE following information respecting the dangers in the approach to Arauco Bay through Boca Chica is the result of a survey by Commander Morris H. Smyth, Her Majesty's surveying vessel "Egeria":—

1. Hall Rock, originally reported in 1859 by Captain Alexander Hall, of the Pacific Steam Navigation Company's vessel "Cloda," was found to be a rocky head of 4 fathoms with 13 to 20 fathoms around. From the rock, Lavapie Point bears N. 46° E. distant $3\frac{5}{8}$ miles, and Loberia Rock S. 29° E. In heavy weather, this rock is marked by breakers.

Approximate position, lat. 37° 9' 55" S., long. 73° 39' 35" W.

2. The rock reported to lie $2\frac{3}{4}$ miles W. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. from Cape Rumena, the existence of which was considered doubtful, but which was reported to have been seen in 1892 by the Chilean vessel "Pilcomago," was searched for without success, and it has been expunged from the Admiralty publications.

Approximate position, lat. 37° 18' 10" S., long. 73° 43' 50" W.

3. Cockatrice Rock, originally placed on the charts on the authority of the Commander-in-Chief of the Pacific Station as having been reported by Mr. James Rundle, Master commanding Her Majesty's ship "Cockatrice" in 1849, and situated with Cadenas Point bearing N. by E. and Cochinos Point E.N.E., was searched for without success, and as the local authorities know nothing of its existence it has been expunged from the Admiralty Charts.

Approximate position, lat. 37° 4' 45" S., long. 73° 35' 35" W.

4. Meteor Rock, originally reported in a collection of Hydrographic Notices on the Coast of Chile, published at Santiago in 1866, as lying one mile south of Cochinos Point and with a depth of 13 feet over it, is situated with Cochinos Point bearing N.N.W., distant 8 cables, and Delicada Point, N.N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. The least depth obtained on this rock was 21 feet.

Approximate position, lat. 37° 5' 10" S., long. 73° 31' 30" W.

5. Hector Rock. In the original Sailing Directions for the Coast of South America by the late Admiral FitzRoy, as well as in his survey executed in the "Beagle" in 1839, a rock named Hector is said to lie near mid-channel between Lavapie Point and Santa Maria Island. This rock was unsuccessfully searched for by Her Majesty's ships "Alert" and "Shearwater," in 1864, and was expunged from the Admiralty Charts.

In 1871 however Captain Nugent Sims, of the Pacific Steam Navigation Company's vessel "Araucania," reported having touched the ground, with Lavapie Point bearing south a distance of

about two miles. This was searched for by Her Majesty's ship "Scylla" in 1872, without success.

In the course of Commander Smyth's survey of 1897, whilst sounding north of Lavapie Point, a depth of 6 fathoms was suddenly obtained with Lavapie Point bearing S.S.E., distant $1\frac{3}{10}$ miles, and Cochin's Point N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. Although the locality was afterwards closely searched by both ship and boats, nothing less than 15 fathoms could be found, notwithstanding that the leadsman was positive he got 6 fathoms, and an officer saw that he had much less water than in his previous cast. It is possible this may be the Hector Rock and also the danger on which the "Araucania" struck. If so it must be a pinnacle which does not break, and on which the least depth has not been satisfactorily ascertained.

Approximate position, lat. $37^{\circ} 6' 30''$ S., long. $73^{\circ} 35' 20''$ W.

Until the rock can be entirely disproved the 6 fathoms will be retained upon the Admiralty Charts as "Hector Rock, possibly less water."

The result of Commander Smyth's survey has now been engraved on Admiralty Chart No. 1303, large correction, January 1898, and this can be obtained from the Admiralty Agent or Sub-Agents.
