PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200.

Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health has, in virtue of the powers vested in him by Ordinance XVI of 1893, been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 36 of the 3rd instant, and to direct that all persons arriving at this Port from Bombay, Kurrachee, Egypt, Beyrouth, the Province of Tripoli, the Regency of Tunis and the Province of Benghazi shall, before landing, give to the Boarding Officer the address of the place where they intend to reside, and should they, before the expiration of 15 days from their arrival, change their place of residence, they shall give due notice to the Superintendent of Police, and give the address of their new residence.

During the period of 15 days from their arrival, all persons referred to in the preceding paragraph of this Notice shall be subject to be visited by the District Medical Officer every day between 10 and 11 A.M. at the Government Dispensary of the district in which such persons reside.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of the Isle of Wight) Order, 1898, dated February 12, 1898.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight, I hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County of the Isle of Wight) Order, 1898.

2. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880" (43 and 44 Vict. cap. 35) shall apply within the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Peregrine Falcon, Raven, Kestrel, Heron, Red-backed Shrike, Whinchat, Spotted Flycatcher,

Sedge Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Wood Warbler, Garden Warbler, Missel Thrush, Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Wheatear, Chiff Chaff, Golden-crested Wren, Yellow Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Water Wagtail, Wryneck, Swallow, Martin (2), Swift.

3. The killing and taking of the birds named in the Schedule to the Act of 1880, and in paragraph 2 of this Order are prohibited in the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight during the whole of that period of the year to which the protection of Wild Birds under that Act does not extend.

4. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight:—
Peregrine Falcon, Raven, Owl, Nightjar, Kestrel, Kingfisher.

5. The taking or destroying of the eggs of Wild Birds is prohibited within the following areas:—

The Red Cliff and Culver Cliffs, between the west side of the Red Cliff Fort on the west and the point of the Culvers forming the western boundary of Whitcliff Bay on the east, from the sea level to the Government boundary; the whole of the cliffs in the parishes of Freshwater and Totland from the westernmost point of Cave Bay, thence round the coast to Sconce Point, and a hundred yards inland from the top of such cliffs.

Provided that the part of this Order numbered 5 shall not be in force after the 27th March, 1906.

6. This Order shall come into force on the 1st May, 1898, from which date the Orders of the 27th March, 1896, and the 30th June, 1897, are hereby repealed.

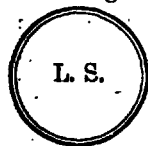

Also, that buoys have been placed in the under-mentioned positions, but as they frequently drift

and are not at once replaced, they should not be relied on:—

1. A red buoy and a white buoy at the edge of the reef on the eastern side of the entrance.

2. Two red buoys at the entrance of the channel leading to Rull.

3. A white buoy at the southern extremity of the reef extending southward from Engnoth Island.

4. A mooring buoy south-westward of Tarrang Island, for the use of vessels coaling there.

NOTE.—Only small vessels, of less than six feet draught, can lie alongside the mole at Tarrang Island; other vessels moor with an anchor from the bows and the stern secured to the mooring buoy.
