A DESPATCH, with enclosures, having been received by the Secretary of State for the Colonies from the High Commissioner for South Africa, the following is published for information:—

Government House, Cape Town,

SIR,

December 13, 1897.

I HAVE the honour to transmit a copy of a Despatch, dated the 15th November, which I have received from Sir R. Martin, containing a general report on the recent operations in Mashonaland.

This document will sufficiently explain the nature of the operations and the difficulties which had to be overcome. It is unnecessary for me to do more than briefly point out how exceptional those difficulties were. The native rising did not gather head at any one point, so that it could be dealt with by a single decisive engagement. There were a number of centres of resistance, and the physical features of the country, full as it is of rocky kopjes which appear at first sight quite impregnable and afford splendid defensive positions, made the task of subduing the scattered bands of rebels as tedious as it was dangerous. During the rainy season, moreover, our forces suffered terribly from fever, as well as from the difficulties of transport. At the beginning of the year their numbers were quite inadequate to the work to be done, so that for some months it was impossible to attempt a vigorous offensive, and even when the police had been largely reinforced, these reinforcements consisted to a great extent of untrained men. Bearing all these facts in mind, I think that the manner in which the operations were conducted and brought to a completely successful issue reflects the greatest credit upon the Commandant-General, upon Commandant Eveleigh de Moleyns, who was, under Sir R. Martin, in general command of the forces, and upon the officers and men of the various forces, which co-operated in the suppression of the rebellion. The losses have unfortunately been heavy in proportion to the numbers engaged, but considering the character of the many natural fastnesses which had to be carried, it is a matter for congratulation that they were not much heavier. Upon the individual courage required to attack positions of that kind, and which was exhibited on so many occasions, it is not necessary to dilate. The discipline also appears to have been generally excellent, and considering that the forces employed consisted largely of new recruits, volunteers, and

natives, this fact is most honourable to the officers commanding them.

Sir R. Martin mentions a number of persons whose services have been specially meritorious, and I venture to hope that these services may receive some recognition. You will no doubt bring under the notice of the Secretary of State for war the names of the officers of the Army, who distinguished themselves during the operations, whether in command of the local forces or of the two squadrons of the 7th Hussars which took part in a number of the engagements. The latter force certainly rendered invaluable service by co-operating in that combined attack upon Mashingombi, the success of which contributed as much as anything to bring the war to a close, and thanks are due to the War Office for allowing this regiment, before leaving Rhodesia, to help in stamping out the Mashona Rebellion. The excellent work done by the Hussars, both in Mashonaland and Matabeleland is, I am glad to say, gratefully acknowledged by the local authorities as well as by the whole body of the white settlers.

I can only say, in conclusion, that, after more than a year of extreme anxiety, Mashonaland is now, to all appearance, perfectly quiet. During my recent visit to the country I passed through districts which had been greatly disturbed, and close to the scene of some of the hottest fighting, without requiring any escort. The natives were peaceable and the settlers have recovered confidence and resumed their ordinary employments. It will probably be necessary to send strong patrols, as soon as the present rainy season is over, to scour the outlying districts, but from all reports no resistance is to be expected, and I think we may regard the rebellion as at an end.

Deputy Commissioner's Office,

SIR,

Bulawayo, November 15, 1897.

I HAVE the honour to report for Your Excellency's information, that the detachment of the 7th Hussars having now left the country and the volunteers having been disbanded, I have directed the police in Mashonaland to resume their ordinary duties.

The natives in Mashonaland are now settling down throughout the country, and the rebellion may safely be said to have terminated.

A large number of chiefs have surrendered, including the Mandora (Kagubi, the Mashona witch doctor), and within the last four weeks 1,094 guns and rifles have been given in.

The rebellion has been one of great difficulty to deal with owing to the fact that there was no paramount chief in the country against whom a decisive blow could be struck, that operations had to be conducted against a large number of small chiefs occupying very strong positions, and that the reduction of one of these had little influence upon the rebels except in the immediate neighbourhood.

As Your Excellency has received from time to time information by telegram of the different engagements, and also a full report of the operations from Commandant the Honourable F. Eveleigh de Moleyns, D.S.O., I do not propose in this despatch to give a detailed account of the various

encounters with the enemy. At the commencement of the year the force at my disposal was very small, and owing to the difficulties of transport and the loss of horses from horse sickness during the rainy season, I was unable to direct an attack with reasonable chance of success against powerful chiefs like Mashingombi and Kunzi; I therefore contented myself with harassing the rebels until the beginning of the dry season, when my force was increased by the 7th Hussars under Major Ridley, detachments of police, volunteers, and native contingent, but at no time did the troops at my disposal exceed 1,400 men.

The casualties during the campaign were as follows:—

7th Hussars.

Killed, 1 private. Wounded, Major H. M. Ridley and 2 privates.

British South Africa Police.

Killed, 10 Non-Commissioned Officers and Men. Wounded, 1 Officer and 13 Non-Commissioned Officers and Men.

Umtali Rifles.

Killed, 2 Non-Commissioned Officers and Men. Wounded, 1 Officer, 2 Non-Commissioned Officers and Men.

Native Contingent.

Killed, 16 Non-Commissioned Officers and Men. Wounded, 1 Officer, 20 Non-Commissioned Officers and Men.

I cannot speak too highly of the manner in which both Officers and men performed their duties in the face of great hardships owing to fever, weather, and difficulties of transport, at all times behaving in the most gallant and cheerful manner, and I trust that it may be possible that the time for the Medal Rolls to be open should be extended to the 31st October, 1897.

I wish especially to convey my appreciation of the manner in which Major H. M. Ridley, Captains G. A. L. Carew and R. M. Poore, and the Officers and men of the 7th Hussars, carried out my wishes in every particular, and greatly assisted in the suppression of the rebellion.

After Major Ridley was wounded Captains Carew and Poore commanded separate columns, and in the attack on Mashingombi these Officers timed their marches, and brought their forces into the field in such a manner as to render my plan of attack by three columns simultaneously entirely successful.

Surgeon-Major S. Hickson, A.M.S., I also wish to mention for the arrangements made for the comfort of, and attention paid to, the sick and wounded of the column to which he was attached, and to acknowledge the services of the Special Service Officers Lieutenant (local Captain) H. G. Moor, R.A., and Captain G. I. Walsh, 1st Leicestershire Regiment.

Although all the Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, and men have, as I have already stated, performed their duties in an exemplary manner, I beg that you will allow me to bring to Your Excellency's notice the following Officers of the British South Africa Police and Volunteers.

Head Quarter Staff.

Major (local Lieutenant-Colonel) P. T. Rivett Carnac (West Riding Regiment), Chief Staff Officer, and Chief Paymaster R. H. Everett I wish to mention for their valuable assistance during the operations; with so small a staff the work was necessarily very arduous.

British South Africa Police, Volunteers, and others.

Commandant (local Lieutenant-Colonel) the Honourable F. R. W. Eveleigh de Moleyns, D.S.O.,

Captain 4th Hussars, deserves my thanks for the great assistance he has rendered me as Commandant of the Mashonaland Division. It was greatly owing to his untiring energy, notwithstanding frequent attacks of fever, and the able manner in which he handled the columns under his command in the field that the rebellion was satisfactorily terminated.

Chief Inspector A. V. Gosling, District Staff Officer, acted as second in command and conducted several important patrols with conspicuous success. He commanded the attack on Kunzi's, and took part in nearly all the encounters with the natives, showing the greatest coolness and gallantry under fire.

Inspector Nesbitt, V.C., took over command of the Hartley District at a time when owing to sickness and loss of horses I feared I might have to order the retirement of the men holding Mashingombi in check, which course would have been, in my opinion, most disastrous. Inspector Nesbitt, acting under my instructions, pushed on to a position within a few hundred yards of Mashingombi's Kraal, thus preventing him from using his Impis to raid the country. He also repelled a determined attack on Fort Martin.

Inspector Harding has been present at almost every action throughout the operations, and was promoted to the rank of Inspector for his gallant conduct in the 1st M'toko Patrol, which was under fire for seven days out of ten. To him is due the rapid improvement in discipline and efficiency of the native contingent.

Sub-Inspectors Griffiths and Ellett served throughout the operations, and have proved themselves reliable Officers under trying circumstances.

Captain F. S. Wilson-Fox, 1st Volunteer Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment, who acted as Galloper to Commandant the Honourable F. de Moleyns, Lieutenants Biscoe, Rhodesia Horse Volunteers (formerly Royal Navy), and Feltham, Rhodesia Horse Volunteers, served almost continuously throughout the campaign, and were of great assistance for their unfailing gallantry in action whilst attached to the British South Africa Police. These three Officers' services were rendered more valuable when there was a scarcity of available Police Officers owing to the prevalence of fever.

The Honourable H. Howard rendered very great assistance in the 1st M'toko Patrol and on many other occasions.

Captain and Local Major D. K. E. Hall, Army Service Corps, who is seconded for service with the British South Africa Company, though not under my command, has always carried out my wishes in the most loyal manner; his duties as Controller of Transport and Supply have been of a most difficult character owing to the rinderpest, the sickness amongst transport animals, and to the rains, but they have been performed in a thoroughly efficient way, and I trust Your Excellency will convey my appreciation of his services to the Military Authorities.

To Major Hamilton Browne, who commanded the Umtali Rifles, the credit is due for the suppression of the rebellion in Soswe's country and the neighbourhood of Marandellas, also for the capture of Soswe as well as several other important chiefs after severe engagements.

Doctor Fleming, Medical Director of the British South Africa Company and Principal Medical Officer, British South Africa Police, was in charge of the medical arrangements, which, owing to the size of the country over which the operations extended, required very careful organization. He was most untiring in his efforts to alleviate the

suffering of the sick and wounded, having frequently travelled all night to bring disabled men into hospital, and he deserves the thanks of Officers and men for his good services. I would also mention Doctors Appleyard and Peel, who were present at most of the engagements.

Chief Native Commissioner Taberer, Native Commissioners Campbell, Morris, and Taylor, and other Native Commissioners have always been ready to accompany the Police as guides and interpreters.

I cannot conclude my despatch without referring to the kind and good services rendered to the sick and wounded by Mother Patrick and Sisters of the Salisbury Hospital. Their tender nursing of the men who were under their care no doubt has been the means of saving many lives. I feel sure that the Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men of all the Forces will remember them with gratitude.

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Brecon)
Order, 1898.

Dated February 14, 1898.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894" (57 and 58 Vict., cap. 24), and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Brecon, I hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County of Brecon) Order, 1898.

2. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Brecon, viz.:—Hobby, Shrikes, Spotted Flycatcher, Pied Flycatcher, Redstart, Wheatear, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Nightingale, Blackcap, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Dartford Warbler, Tree Pipit, Wrenneck, Sand Martin, Swift, Nightjar, Turtle Dove, Quail, Dotterel, Sandpiper or Summer-snipe, all Owls, Woodlark, Landrail or Corn-crake, Water Rail, all Woodpeckers, Nuthatch, Kite, Buzzard, Kestrel, Water Ouzel, Creeper, Stonechat, Goldcrest, Whinchat, Lontailed Tit, Bearded Tit, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Goldfinch, Curlew, Kingfisher, Snipe, Teal, Widgeon, Wild Duck.

3. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880" (43 and 44 Vict., cap. 35), shall apply, within the Administrative County of Brecon, to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—Hobby, Great Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Spotted Flycatcher, Pied Flycatcher, Redstart, Wheatear, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Nightingale, Blackcap, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Dartford Warbler, Tree Pipit, Hoopoe, Roller, Barn Swallow, House Martin, Sand Martin, Swift, Turtle Dove, Quail, Pied Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Rock Lark, Richard's Lark, Skylark, Woodlark,

Landrail, Water Rail, Robin, Wren, Goldcrest, Longtailed Tit, Bearded Tit, Kite.

4. The Order of the 2nd October, 1896, is hereby repealed.

WHEREAS by section 10 of the "Imported Stock Act of 1871," the Governor may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, restrict or absolutely prohibit for any specified time the importation or introduction of any stock, fodder, or fittings from any other Colony or country in which there is reason to believe any infectious or contagious disease in stock exists: And whereas there is reason to believe that certain infectious and contagious diseases exist in some of the countries of Europe, Asia, Africa, America, and in Colonies other than the Australian Colonies: Now, therefore, I, Henry Robert, Viscount Hampden, the Governor aforesaid, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby restrict, as set forth in Schedule A hereto, and absolutely prohibit, as set forth in Schedule B hereto, for a period of two years from the date hereof, the importation or introduction into this Colony of the stock, articles, or things mentioned in the said Schedules from the Countries or Colonies therein named:—

THE following Regulation, made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, for carrying into effect the provisions of the abovenamed Acts with regard to the application of the Mallein and Tuberculin Test to Horses or Cattle intended to be shipped to this Colony and the duration of Quarantine for Stock, is hereby published for general information.

SYDNEY SMITH.

Application of Mallein and Tuberculin Tests to Horses and Cattle.

All horses intended to be shipped from any place other than any of the Australian Colonies (which include Tasmania and New Zealand) shall, before being shipped, be subjected by the Veterinary Surgeon appointed to examine and grant certificates of health for stock intended to be shipped for this Colony to a Mallein Test, and all cattle from any such place shall be subjected to a Tuberculin Test; and if any of such horses or cattle shall, in the opinion of such Veterinary Surgeon, react to such test, he will refuse to grant a certificate of health, and such horses or cattle, as the case may be, shall not be admitted into this Colony.

This Regulation to take effect three months after the date of issue.

Duration of Quarantine for Stock from places outside the Australian Colonies.

The several kinds of Stock from places outside the Australian Colonies mentioned below admitted to quarantine shall remain therein for the respective periods herein specified, dating from the day of removal from the vessel, namely:—
