Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Borough of Bootle) Order, 1898.

Dated March 9, 1898.

WHEREAS by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880" (43 and 44 Vict. cap. 35), the killing or taking of any kind of Wild Bird during the period between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in any year was prohibited:

Now, I, the Right Honourable Sir Matthew

White Ridley, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1896 (59 and 60 Vict. cap. 56), and for special reasons which have been placed before me in an application from the Council of the Borough of Bootle, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Borough of Bootle) Order, 1898.

2. During the period from the 1st day of August in any year to the 1st day of March following, the taking or killing of all Wild Birds is prohibited in and upon that part of the River Mersey which is included within the boundary of the Borough of Bootle.

No. 125.—NEW ZEALAND—NORTH ISLAND.

Kaipara Harbour—Alterations in Leading Beacons.

THE Government of New Zealand has given notice, dated 12th January, 1898, that the leading beacons on North Head, Kaipara Harbour, were then being taken down, the two upper (north-eastern) beacons would be re-erected about one mile westward of their previous positions, and the lower (previous south-western) beacon would be discontinued.

Approximate new position, rear beacon, lat. 36° 22' 15" S., long. 174° 6' 55" E.

NOTE.—Further notice will be given when the beacons have been re-erected; in the meantime Kaipara Harbour should be entered with great caution, and particular attention should be paid to any signals made from the station near the light-house.

THE Government of New Zealand has given notice, dated 12th January, 1898, that a fog signal apparatus is in course of erection in a position 384 feet, S.W., from Pencarrow Head Light-house, and at an elevation of 145 feet above the sea.

Massawa Harbour—Alterations in Positions of Seraglio Island Lights.

THE Italian Government has given notice, dated 14th February, 1898, that the two red lights previously shown on either side of the base of the Palace Central Dome, Seraglio Island, have been moved, so that they are now leading lights for entering Massawa Harbour:—

1. The front light is shown from a staff at the edge of the quay, at an elevation of 4 feet above the sea, in a position with the French Consulate bearing about S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., distant $2\frac{3}{8}$ cables; and north-east angle of Taoualoud Fort S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

Approximate position, lat. $15^{\circ} 36' 45''$ N., long. $39^{\circ} 26' 50'' E.$

The rear light is shown from the terrace at the north-east angle of the Colonial Palace, at an elevation of 72 feet above the sea, and in a position bearing S. 67° W., distant 126 yards, from the front light.

NOTE.—The above lights in line, bearing S. 67° W., lead into Massawa Harbour midway between the buoys at the entrance.

Southampton Water—Intended Lights on Structures at Entrance.

NOTICE is given that, early in June, 1898, the undermentioned lights will be shown from certain of the structures recently placed in the water at the entrance of Southampton Water:—

1. From the structure situated on the west side of Southampton Water, in a position N. 25° E., distant half a cable, from Calshot Castle Light-house, a fixed red light.
