

Their Imperial Highnesses The Grand Duke Serge and The Grand Duchess Elizabeth Feodowna of Russia, attended by The Countess Olsoufiew, Grande Maitresse de la Cour, and General Stepanoff, General à la Suite, arrived at Windsor Station and drove to Frogmore, where they were received by The Queen.

The Grand Duke and Duchess were met at the station by Their Royal Highnesses The Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein and The Princess Beatrice, Princess Henry of Battenberg.

Miss Minnie Cochrane and Major-General Sir John McNeill, K.C.B., K.C.M.G., D.C., were in attendance at the railway station, and a guard of honour was mounted of the 2nd Battalion Coldstream Guards.

Windsor Uniform was worn by the Gentlemen in Waiting.

After dinner The Queen witnessed a Military Tattoo in the Quadrangle.

The Bands of the Household Cavalry, the Royal Artillery, the Royal Engineers, the Brigade of Guards, the Drums of the Brigade of Guards, and the Pipers of the Scots Guards played during the Tattoo.

Her Majesty was received with a Royal Salute.

The last post, Infantry, was blown by the Buglers of the Guards from the base of King John's Tower, and the Cavalry Trumpeters sounded the last post from the top of the Round Tower.

Guards of Honour of the Royal Horse Guards (Blue) and 2nd Battalion of Coldstream Guards were mounted, under the command of Captain G. J. Fitz-Gerald and Captain The Hon. E. Pakenham respectively.

At the conclusion of the Tattoo the two Guards of Honour marched past The Queen.

Field Marshal Viscount Wolseley, K.P., Commander-in-Chief, and Major-General Lord Methuen, C.B., Commanding the Home District, were honoured with invitations to be present.

In the course of the day and evening all Her Majesty's Royal Guests arrived in London, and having been met by the Officers of Her Majesty's Household appointed to be in attendance upon them, were conducted with their Suites to the Residences prepared for their Reception.

The Representatives of Foreign Courts and States, in like manner, arrived at their various Residences; as well as the Officers of the 1st Prussian Dragoons of the Guard ("Queen of Great Britain and Ireland's").

The Native Princes of India and the Premiers of the Colonies had previously arrived and taken up their residence.
