When the Royal Yacht anchored, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales received on board all Flag Officers and Staff Officers, after which His Royal Highness returned to Portsmouth.

At 9.30 o'clock p.m., His Royal Highness again proceeded to Spithead in the "Alberta," to witness the illumination of the Fleet, which lasted from 9.15 o'clock p.m. until midnight. The Prince made the tour of the Fleet, and then returned into harbour.
