The Queen held an Investiture to-day at Windsor.

Her Majesty, accompanied by Their Royal Highnesses The Duke of Connaught and Strathearn and Princess Henry of Battenberg, proceeded to the White Drawing Room at a quarter before three o'clock.

ORDER OF THE INDIAN EMPIRE.

Sir George Faudel Faudel-Phillips, Bart., late Lord Mayor of the City of London, was introduced into the presence of The Sovereign, attended by Mr. C. G. Barrington, C.B., Gentleman Usher to the Order of the Bath, carrying the Insiguia, when The Queen conferred upon him the honour of Knighthood, and invested him with the Riband and Badge of a Knight Grand Commander of the Order (by placing the Riband over the right shoulder obliquely to the left side), and affixed to his left breast the Star of the Order.
