

The Queen was pleased to make a fresh issue of the Jubilee Medal of 1887, in Gold, Silver and Bronze, on the present occasion to mark the Commemoration of the 60th Anniversary of Her Reign.

It was conferred upon the Members of The Royal Family, The Royal Guests and their Suites, and upon the Ladies and Gentlemen of The Queen's and other Households.

Her Majesty also presented it to the officially accredited Envoys as well as to the Foreign Ambassadors and Heads of Missions resident in this country, also to the Colonial Prime Ministers and Members of the Indian and Colonial Contingents who came over to this country for the Jubilee.

All recipients of the Jubilee Medal in 1887 were on this occasion awarded a Clasp or Bar for 1897.

The Decoration was also conferred upon a large number of Officers of the Army, Navy, and Auxiliary Forces who took part in the Procession on the 22nd June, and Naval and Military Reviews, as well as upon Members of the Cabinet and their Wives, and various other Ladies and Gentlemen.

Medals in Commemoration of the Diamond Jubilee were also presented by the Government in The Queen's name to the Mayors and Provosts of Great Britain and Ireland, the Metropolitan and City Police, and some others.

Gold Diamond-shaped Medals were given to the Lord Mayors and Lord Provosts, and Silver Medals of a like shape to Mayors and Provosts.

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
