#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

#### NORTH RIDING OF YORKSHIRE (MUZZLING OF DOGS) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1898.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of

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every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Amendment of the North Riding of Yorkshire

(Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1897.

1. The North Riding of Yorkshire (Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1897 dated the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninetyseven is hereby amended as follows:

#### Exclusion of Certain Portions of North Riding from Muzzling Order.

From and after the commencement of this Order, the provisions of the said Muzzling Order shall not extend or apply to the portions of the District of the Local Authority of the North Riding of the county of York described in the Schedule to this Order, and the said Muzzling Order shall be read and have effect accordingly: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Muzzling Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Muzzling Order before the commencement of this Order.


#### Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

3. This Order may be cited as the NORTH RIDING OF YORKSHIRE (MUZZLING OF DOGS) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1898.
