CIRCULAIRE.

Le Conseil Sanitaire Supérieur de la Princi-

pauté, ayant en vue l'apparition de la peste, a édicté les mesures prophylactiques suivantes :—

1. Tous les voyageurs, arrivant avec les bateaux à vapeur et navires, des ports de la Mer Rouge ne peuvent entrer dans la Principauté que par les ports de Varna et de Bourgas, après une désinfection rigoureuse de tous leurs effets ;

2. Les voyageurs qui viennent des ports de la Mer Rouge et entrent dans la Principauté par voie de terre, seront soumis à une inspection médicale à Hébilchévo; leurs bagages et habits seront soumis à une désinfection rigoureuse. Tous les autres points d'entrée par voie de terre de la Principauté sont fermés à ces voyageurs ;

3. Est considéré comme infesté tout le littoral de la Mer Rouge à l'exception de Suez.
