THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Montevideo, enclosing the following translation of a Notice respecting Quarantine, viz. :—

*National Board of Health,  
Montevideo, March 16, 1898.*

THE National Board of Health, in virtue of the powers conferred on it by the Law of the 30th October of 1895, and being duly authorized thereto, decrees:—

ART. 1. Ships clearing from the ports of Rio Janeiro and Santos or calling at these ports shall be subjected to 24 hours' sanitary observation.

ART. 2. Passengers bound for the Port of Montevideo will land at Flores Island Lazaret to undergo the observation. On leaving the Lazaret they will be furnished with a sanitary passport, and are to be under surveillance on shore for five days.

Baggage shall be disinfected at the Lazaret. If the disinfection cannot be carried out in the period fixed for observation this latter shall be prolonged.

ART. 3. Sailing-ships which have been at sea less than eight days, shall be disinfected and kept under observation for the time appointed as above. Ships which have been on the voyage for more than eight days shall be admitted to pratique when they are once disinfected.

ART. 4. Cargo and mails shall be landed without any restrictions.

ART. 5. Ships arriving in port, and which have or may have had cases of yellow fever on board, shall be subjected to the sanitary measures established in each case.

ART. 6. No vessel will be admitted to pratique without having undergone disinfection.

ART. 7. These measures shall be enforced from this day.

ART. 8. Let this be published, &c., &c.

## WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Norfolk)  
Order, 1898.

Dated 6th April, 1898.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Norfolk, I hereby make the following Order:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Norfolk) Order, 1898."

## Eggs.

*All Eggs Protected in certain Areas.*

II.—(1.) The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited for a period of one year from the 1st day of May, 1898, within the following areas—

(a.) Hickling Broad, Whitesley and Heigham Sounds, Blackfoot Broad, Horsey Mere, Martham and Somerton Broads, and the rands, skirts, and walls thereof, and fens and reed grounds appertaining thereto respectively, and the islands therein, and the dykes communicating therewith, including the Hundred Stream or Thurne River and ancient bed, and the rands and walls thereof, from Heigham Bridge to the sea at Winterton, and all the marshes and low-lying and uncultivated lands, fens, reed grounds, warrens, maram, or sand-hills and seashore, to the line of high-water mark, in the several parishes of Waxham, Horsey, Potter Heigham, and Hickling, and such part of the parish of Catfield as lies to the east of the Midland and Great Northern Joint Railway.

(b.) The warrens, maram, or sand-hills, and sea-shore to the line of high-water mark in the parish of Winterton.

(c.) The series of Broads known as Ormesby, Rollesby, Hemsby, Filby, and Burgh Broads, and the rands, skirts, and walls thereof, and the dykes communicating therewith, and the fens, reed-grounds, and low-lying lands, marshes, and pastures adjacent thereto, including Lady Broad or Hard Fen Water, in the parish of Filby, Brandyke Broad, in the parish of Burgh St. Margaret, and Muckfleet Dyke, and the marshes and low-lying lands and pastures near or adjacent thereto respectively.

(d.) The whole of the foreshore, including the shingle, sand-hills, salt-marshes, creeks, and other unenclosed lands extending from high-water mark to the first boundary of enclosed or cultivated land separating the foreshore from them, from the Estuary Sluice at North Wootton to the eastern boundary of the parish of Cley-next-the-Sea.

(2.) The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the county of Norfolk, viz.:—Bearded Titmouse or Reed Pheasant (*Panurus biarmicus*), Crossbill (*Loxia curvirostris*), White or Barn Owl (*Strix flammea*), Wild Ducks and Teal of all species, Norfolk Plover, Stone Curlew or Thickknee (*Edicnemus scolopax*), Ruff or Reeve (*Machetes pugnax*), Ring Dotterel, Ring Plover or Stone Runner (*Agialitis hiaticula*), Oyster Catcher or Sea Pie (*Hæmatopus ostralegus*), Terns, Sea Swallows, Pearls or Dipears (*Sterna*), all species, Great Crested Grebe or Loon (*Podiceps cristatus*).

## BIRDS.

*Additions to Schedule of Act of 1880.*

III. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within the county of Norfolk to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule

to the Act:—Bearded Titmouse or Reed Pheasant, Crossbill, Owls (all species except the White or Barn Owl, which is already mentioned in the schedule), Kingfisher, Sandmartin.

IV. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the county of Norfolk, so far as regards all birds mentioned in the schedule to that Act, except the snipe, teal, and all species of Wild Duck, so as to be from the 1st March to the 31st August in any year.

V. The Orders of the 8th April, 1895, and 30th March, 1897, are hereby repealed.

*Restriction on holding Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions at Builth.*

1. The holding of markets fairs sales or exhibitions of cattle sheep or swine within the Urban District of Builth in the county of Brecon is hereby prohibited except as expressly authorized by this Order.

*Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions by Licence of Local Authority.*

2. A market fair sale or exhibition of cattle sheep or swine may be held within the Urban District of Builth with a Licence of the Council of the county of Brecon in any case where the Council have, previous to the granting of the Licence, satisfied themselves that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being cleansed and disinfected in accordance with the Regulations of the Council in that behalf for the time being in force.

*Copies of Licences to be sent to Board of Agriculture.*

3. The Council shall forthwith send to the Board of Agriculture a copy of every Licence

granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order.

*Revocation by Board of Agriculture of Licences.*

4. If the Board of Agriculture are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

*Offences.*

5. If a market fair sale or exhibition of cattle sheep or swine is held in the Urban District of Bournemouth in contravention of this Order, the person or company holding the same, and the occupier of the place or premises where the market or fair or sale or exhibition is held; and the owner or consignee of each head of cattle and of each sheep or pig exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale or exhibition, and the person, if any, taking entrance-money or other payment for admission thereto, and the purchaser thereof of any cattle sheep or swine, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market or fair or sale or exhibition to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

6. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
