

FAIRS.

Alteration of Date.
SHAFTESBURY (DORSET).

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Shaftesbury, that a Fair has been annually held at Shaftesbury, in the county of Dorset, on the eve of the Feast of St. Martin and the day of and the day following such Feast, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should in future be held on the eve of and the third Saturday and following Monday in the month of November in each year.

And whereas the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses are owners of the said Fair :

And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I should take the same into consideration, has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1873."

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should in future be held on the eve of and the third Saturday and following Monday in the month of November in each year.

Now therefore I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act 1873," do hereby order that the Fair which has been annually held at Shaftesbury, in the county of Dorset, on the eve of the Feast of St. Martin and the day of and the day following such Feast, shall in future be held on the eve of and the third Saturday and following Monday in the month of November in each year.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked : Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
