PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained

at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be rery distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations at each Drawing Room is limited to 200.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

ER Majesty having signified Her Royal pleasure that the public solemnization of the Funeral of the Right Honourable William Ewart Gladstone shall take place in Westminster

This is to request that all Privy Councillors, under the degree of the Peerage, desirous of being present on the occasion, will signify the same to me, by letter addressed as above, on or before the 26th instant (after which no application can be received), in order that places may be reserved

Those persons in the Procession as also those having seats in the Abbey are to appear in

Morning Dress.

The body will lie during Thursday and Friday next, the 26th and 27th instant, in Westminster Hall, to which the public will be admitted. And the Funeral will take place in Westminster Abbey on Saturday morning, the 28th instant. body will be preceded to the Abbey by both Houses of Parliament and Privy Councillors, and will be followed by the Family and Mourners.

Peers and Members of the House of Commons are earnestly requested to inform respectively the Lord Chancellor's Secretary and the Speaker's Secretary not later than Wednesday evening whether they intend to take part in the ceremony, in order that tickets may be forwarded to them. Privy Councillors who are not Members of either House of Parliament will receive tickets of admission if they apply to the Earl Marshal by Wednesday evening, giving the address to which the tickets should be sent.

Owing to the shortness of the time, it will not be possible to enlarge the accommodation on the floor of the Abbey, and therefore the only persons besides those who take part in the procession and Members of the Corps Diplomatique whom the Earl Marshal will be able to admit will be representatives of national institutions.

It has been decided to invite representatives of the Navy, Army, and Civil Service, and likewise of the Universities and other learned bodies. Invitations to those whom it will be possible to admit in this capacity will be duly forwarded.

With a view to giving as representative a character as possible to the assemblage, it has been further decided that the head of every Municipality and County Council throughout the United Kingdom, or a nominee appointed by him, should be provided with a seat inside the Abbey. Under this designation would come (a) in England, Lord Mayors and Mayors, and Chairmen of County Councils, or a nominee appointed by them; (b) in Scotland, Lord Provosts and Provosts, and Chairmen of County Councils, or a nominee appointed by them; (c) in Ireland, Lord Mayors and Mayors, and foremen of the grand juries at the last assizes, or a nominee appointed by them. Those who propose to take advantage of this privilege, either themselves or by deputy, must inform the Earl Marchal.

No application can be entertained unless it is received by Thursday, and the application must contain the name and designation of the applicant and the exact address to which the ticket should be sent. As no tickets can be issued before Thursday night, care should be exercised to furnish, if possible, an address in London .-

This notice of denunciation, which was received on the 30th of March last, being in conformity with the provisions of Article XXIII of that Treaty, has been accepted by Her Majesty's Government, and the said Treaty will cease and determine accordingly on the 30th of March,

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following copy of a Notice dated 17th May, issued by the Governor of Malta, viz. :

Government Notice.—(No. 132.)

HIS Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 124 of the 14th May, 1898, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz.:-

1. Vessels which are not allowed to enter the harbour, but are allowed to communicate in quarantine with the Islands of Comino and Cominotto under such restrictions as the Collector of Customs may direct.

(a) Vessels that have on board, or have had during the voyage cases of cholera, yellow fever, or plague, or cases of a disease with symptoms resembling those of cholera, yellow fever or plague.

(b) Vessels with pilgrims from the East.
(c) Vessels arriving from Arabian Ports in the

been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said

2. Vessels which are allowed to enter the Quarantine Harbour to coal and take in provisions

under quarantine restrictions.

(a) Vessels arriving from Bombay or Kurrachee which have not been admitted to free pratique in a port in the Adriatic or Mediterranean Sea, or which have not, to the satisfaction of the Chief Government Medical Officer, been thoroughly disinfected before being admitted to free pratique at the said Port.

(b) Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health, which do not fall under any

of the preceding regulations.

Vessels without a clean bill of health that carry a doctor may complete a period of ten days' quarantine, reckoned from date of departure, either at sea or at the anchorage of Comino, before being admitted under the same conditions as arrivals from Bombay.

3. Medical Inspection.

All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergo strict medical inspection.

4. Passengers.

Passengers arriving from Bombay or Kurrachee shall be landed in one of the quarantine establishments, where they will be subjected to strict medical inspection until their clothing and all other articles of personal use likely to retain infection shall have been thoroughly disinfected.

5. Goods.

The importation of coffee coloured with substances injurious to health is prohibited.

The importation of cotton seed from any port

subject to quarantine is forbidden,

The importation of rags is prohibited.

The importation is forbidden, before disinfection, of the following articles, viz., wearing apparel, soiled linen and clothing, bedding materials, feathers, bones, and jute goods.

The importation of hides from any port subject to quarantine or from any place where cattle disease exists, is prohibited before disinf ction.

The importation of vines, vine shoots, and fruit packed in vine leaves, is prohibited. The importation of plants, or roots from any port of the Mediterranean is prohibited unless the same are accompanied by a satisfactory certificate that Phylloxera is not known to exist at the place of origin.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District :-

Northampton-hire Audit District.

To George Langford Gibson, District Au-

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order ;-

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised within the said Unions respectively;

To the Authorities referred to in Article I (3) of this Order;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enucted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas the said George Langford Gibson, who is now acting as Assistant District Auditor in the Somersetshire and Dorsetshire Audit District, has been duly appointed a District Auditor under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf;

And whereas Rowland Metzner Estcourt is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf, and is acting as Auditor for the Northamptonshire Audit District:

And whereas another District has been assigned to the said Rowland Metzner Estcourt, and it is expedient that the Northamptonshire Audit District should be assigned to the said George Langford Gibson (hereinafter referred to as "the said District Auditor") in lieu of to the said Rowland Metzner Estcourt;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment of the said District Auditor accordingly, and hereby Order and Prescribe as follows:

ARTICLE I .- It shall be the duty of the said District Auditor, on and after the date hereof, to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers; namely,

(1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order.

- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said, several Poor Law Unions.
 - (3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said
 - (4.) Such of the other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order under our Seal hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the said District Auditor shall, on and after the date hereof, act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him, in lieu of to the said Rowland Metzner Estcourt, for the performance of his duties under this Order, and which shall be termed "The Northamptonshire Audit District," shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to the Order, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is men-

tioned in paragraph (4) of Article I of this Order.
