REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations at each Drawing Room is limited to 200.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given for the proper purposes that, with reference to the opinion given by the Consultative Board of Public Health, it has been decided by order of the Government that, at the Port of Leixoes, the landing of merchandise and other articles which, as far as regards cholera and yellow fever, are exempted from undergoing the process of disinfection or cleansing in accordance with Article 107 of the General Maritime Sanitary Regulations, will be allowed subject to the rule of strict non-communication, provided such admission shall not in any way contravene the provision set forth in Article 108 of the said Regulations, and provided the sanitary authorities will make themselves responsible for such non-communication, the observance of which is to be enforced under their personal supervision.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Kent)
Order, 1898.

Dated 25th May, 1898.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Kent, I hereby make the following Order:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Kent) Order, 1898."

EGGS.

All Eggs Protected in Certain Areas.

II. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' eggs is prohibited within the following areas in the county of Kent for the space of two years, from the 20th March, 1898:—

1. So much of the Isle of Sheppey (including therein Elmley Island) as lies south of the road running from Queenborough, through Eastchurch, to Warden Point.

2. An area bounded on the west by so much of the Sittingbourne and Sheerness Railway as lies between Kingsferry and the Sittingbourne Railway Station, and bounded on the south by the London Chatham and Dover Railway from Sittingbourne Railway Station to Whitstable Railway Station, and bounded on the east by the main road from Whitstable Station to the sea, and bounded on the north by the Swale and Whitstable Bay.

3. An area bounded on the west by the Minster and Deal branch of the South Eastern Railway from Minster Railway Station to Deal Railway Station, and bounded on the south by the road from Deal Railway Station to Deal Pier, and bounded on the east by the sea, and bounded on the north by the South Eastern Railway from Minster Station to Ramsgate Station.

4. An area lying east and south of the main road from Walmer through Dover to Folkestone from the point where such road passes through the southern boundary of the Walmer Urban District to the point where such road enters the borough of Folkestone, such area being bounded on the east and south by the sea, and on the north by the Walmer Urban District, and on the south by the borough of Folkestone.

5. An area lying south and west of the main road which runs from Appledore Railway Station through Snargate, Brenzett, and Old Romney, to New Romney Station, and thence to Littlestone-on-Sea, such area being bounded on the north-west by the Royal Military Canal from Appledore Railway Station to the Sussex Boundary, and bounded on the south-west by the Sussex Boundary, and on the south and east by the sea.

Certain Eggs protected outside the Metropolitan Police District.

III. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within so much of the county of Kent as is

not within the Metropolitan Police District :—
Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Buzzard, Fly Catchers (2), Goldfinch, Golden Oriole, Great Plover (Thick Knee), Hawfinch, Hen-harrier, Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Hoopoe, Kentish Plover, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Osprey, Owl (all species), Peregrine Falcon, Swallow, Swift, Turtle Dove, Wryneck.

Certain Eggs protected within the Metropolitan Police District.

IV. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within so much of the county of Kent as is within the Metropolitan Police District :—Nightingale, Goldfinch, Lark, Nightjar, Woodpecker, Kingfisher, Cuckoo, Owls, Shrike, Kestrel, Wryneck, Swallow, Martins (2), Swift, Bearded Tit, Merlin, Hobby, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Osprey, Magpie, Wheatear, Stonechat, Whinchat, Redstart, Flycatchers (2), Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Blackcap, Garden Warbler, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Longtailed Tit, Nuthatch, Wren, Golden Crested Wren, Wagtails (4), Hawfinch, Linnet, Buntings (3), Starling, Landrail or Corn-crake, Coot.

BIRDS.

Extension of Close Time throughout the County.

V. The time during which the killing and taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall, except as regards the Common Wild Duck, be varied throughout the county of Kent, so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 12th day of August in each year.

Act of 1880 applied to Certain Birds outside Metropolitan Police District.

VI. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within so much of the county of Kent as is not within the Metropolitan Police District to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act :—Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Buzzard, Chaffinch, Flycatchers (2), Hawfinch, Hen-harrier, Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Kentish Plover, Kestrel, Martin, Merlin, Moorhen, Osprey, Peregrine Falcon, Swallow, Swift, Turtle Dove, Wryneck.

Act of 1880 applied to Certain Birds within Metropolitan Police District.

VII. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within so much of the county of Kent as is within the Metropolitan Police District to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act :—Shrike, Kestrel, Wryneck, Swallow, Martins (2), Swift, Bearded Tit, Merlin, Hobby, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Osprey, Magpie.

VIII. The Order of the 11th March, 1896, is hereby repealed.

(b.) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

2. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

3. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. English Composition, to be tested by a short essay or letter on a simple subject.
4. Arithmetic, including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions and Percentages.
5. Geography (general).

Candidates who fail to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent

amount of general proficiency will not be regarded as qualified.

4. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height, and no officer will be retained in the Service who does not attain the height of 5 feet 4 inches before completing his nineteenth year.

5. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by his parent or guardian, that he will, if successful, reside either with his parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by them.

6. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service, Engineer Students in the Navy, and Apprentices in Her Majesty's Dockyards, will not be eligible unless they produce to the Civil Service Commissioners the written permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition.

7. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. A fee of 4s. will be required from every Candidate attending the Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for not fewer than 50 Male Learners in London will be held under the foregoing Regulations in London, commencing on the 26th July, 1898.

thereof to the Oakeley Slate Quarries Company Limited (hereinafter called the Slate Company) and is also seized subject to the same lease of the lands adjoining such part of the said existing branch railway as is hereinafter authorized to be abandoned: And whereas the said William Edward Oakeley and the Slate Company have agreed subject to this Certificate being obtained to grant and convey to the Festiniog Railway Company the lands required for the said Deviation Railway and works in connection therewith in consideration of the Railway Company agreeing to convey to the said William Edward Oakeley and the Slate Company the site of such portion of the existing railway as is hereinafter authorized to be abandoned when the same shall have been abandoned: And whereas the Festiniog Railway Company has complied with the requirements of the Railways Construction Facilities Act 1864 and the Railways (Powers and Construction) Acts 1864 Amendment Act 1870.

Now therefore the Board of Trade do by this their Certificate in pursuance of the said Acts and by virtue and in exercise of the powers thereby in them vested and of every other power enabling them in this behalf certify as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Certificate may be cited as "The Festiniog Railway (Deviation) Certificate 1898."

Interpretation.

2. In this Certificate the expression "the Company" means the Festiniog Railway Company.

Power to construct Deviation Railway.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Certificate the Company may on the lands contracted to be purchased by them as aforesaid make and maintain the Deviation Railway shown on the plans and sections deposited in respect of the application for this Certificate in the lines and according to the levels shown on such plans and sections with all proper stations sidings approaches works and conveniences connected therewith.

The Deviation Railway authorized in this Certificate will be situate wholly in the parish of Festiniog in the county of Merioneth and commence by a junction with the existing main line of railway of the Company at or about the junction therewith in the direction of Portmadoc of the Dinas Mineral Branch Railway of the Company and terminate by a junction with the said Dinas Mineral Branch Railway of the Company at the Dinas Station thereon.

Gauge of Railway.

4. The Deviation Railway shall be constructed on a gauge of one foot eleven inches and three-quarters of an inch.

Time for Completion.

5. If the Deviation Railway is not completed within three years from the passing of this Certifi-

cate then on the expiration of that period the powers by this Certificate granted to the Company for making and completing the same or otherwise in relation thereto shall cease to be exercised except as to so much thereof as is then completed.

Tolls

6. The Deviation Railway by this Certificate authorized shall for all purposes be deemed to be part of the railways of the Company authorized by the Festiniog Railway Act 1869. When and so soon as the Deviation Railway shall have been completed and opened for public conveyance of passengers the Company may abandon the user of so much of the existing railway of the Company as will be situate between the points of junction therewith of the said Deviation Railway and will be rendered unnecessary by the construction of such Deviation Railway and may take up remove and utilize the rails plates sleepers signals signal boxes and other plant works and conveniences connected therewith and may convey and dispose of the site of such portion of the existing railway to the said William Edward Oakeley and the Slate Company in such manner and for such estates and interests as shall be agreed upon.

Provision as to General Acts.

9. Nothing in this Certificate contained shall exempt the Company or the railway from the provisions of any general Act relating to railways or the better or more impartial audit of the accounts of railway companies now in force or which may hereafter pass during this or any future Session of Parliament or from any future revision or alteration under the authority of Parliament of the maximum rates of fares and charges or of the rates for small parcels.

Costs.

10. All costs charges and expenses of and incidental to the preparing for obtaining and passing of this Certificate or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Company.

Ayrshire.—An Area comprising the parishes of Largs, Kilbirnie, West Kilbride, Dalry, Ardrossan, Stevenston, Kilwinning, Beith, Dunlop, Stewarton, Irvine, Dreghorn, Kilmaurs, Fenwick, Kilmarnock, Loudoun, and Galston, in the county of Ayr, and also comprising the burghs of Irvine, and Kilmarnock (14 April, 1898).

Berkshire and Buckinghamshire.—An Area comprising the parishes of Bray, and Cookham, and the municipal borough of Maidenhead, in the county of Berks, and also comprising the petty sessional divisions of the Hundred of Stoke, the Hundred of Desborough (First Division), and the Hundred of Desborough (Second Division), and the parishes of Wooburn, Boveney, Burnham, Dorney, Farnham Royal, Hedgerley Dean, Hitcham, and Taplow, in the county of Buckingham, and also comprising the borough of Chepping (or High) Wycombe (10 February, 1898).
