PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained

at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be rery distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations at each Drawing

Room is limited to 200.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levecs.

Board of Trade (Fisheries Department), London, June 1, 1898.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, notifying that the whole of India has been declared infected with plague since 1st April last, and that goods and vessels which left India after that date will be subjected in Bulgaria to the precautionary measures indicated in Circulars dated 12th February and 4th April respectively.

Her Majesty's Representative also notifies the fact that as most of the sacks imported into Bulgaria are made in Calcutta the importation of sacks from the United Kingdom without certificates of origin will henceforth only be permitted after disinfection at the expense of their owners.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application from the County Council of the Administrative County of Middlesex, I hereby make the following Order:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Middlesex) Order, May, 1898."

II. BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

(1.) The time during which the killing and taking of W.ld Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended, so far as concerns the County of Middlesex, so as to be from the 1st February to the 31st August in every year.

Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

(2.) During the period from the 1st of September in any year to the 31st January following, the taking or killing of any of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Middlesex:—Nightingale, Goldfinch, Lark, Nightjar, Woodpeckers, Kingfisher, Cuckoo, Owls, Kestrel, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Merlin, Hobby, Osprey, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Martins (2); Swift, Bearded Tit, Reedling or Reed Pheasant, Shrikes, Magpie, Wheatear, Stonechat, Whinchat, Red Start, Fly Catchers, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Black Cap, Garden Warbler, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiff Chaff, White Throat, Lesser White Throat, Long Tailed Tit, Nuthatch, Wren, Golden Crested Wren, Wagtails (4), Hawfinch, Linnet, Buntings (3), Starling, Landrail or Corncrake, Coot, Chaffinch.

All Birds Protected on Sundays in Certain Parishes.

(3.) During the period from the 1st September in any year to the 31st January following the taking or killing of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in the following parishes in the county of Middlesex :-- Acton, Ashford, Bedfont, New Brentford, Old Brentford, Chiswick, Cowley, Cranford, West Drayton, Ealing, Edgware, Edmonton, Enfield, Feltham, Finchley, Friern Barnet, Greenford, Hampton, Hampton Wick, Hanwell, Hanworth, Harefield, Harlington, Harmondsworth, Harrow-on-the-Hill, Harrow Weald, Hayes, Hendon, Heston, Hillingdon East, Hillingdon West, Hornsey, Ickenham, Isleworth, Kingsbury, Laleham, Littleton, Northolt, Norwood, Perivale, Pinner, Ruislip, Shepperton, Southgate, South Mimms, Staines, Great Stanmore, Little Stanmore, Stanwell, Sunbury, Teddington, Tottenham, Twickenham, Abbey, Uxbridge, Wealdstone, Wembley, Willesden, Wood Green, Yiewsley.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

(4.) "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within the county of Middlesex to the Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Martins (2), Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Shrikes, Kestrel, Merlin, Hobby, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Osprey, Magpie, and Chaffinch, as if those species were included in the Schedule to the said Act.

III. Eggs.

The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following Wild Bilds is probibited within the county of Middlesex, viz.:—Nightingale, Goldfinch, Lark, Nightjar, Woodpeckers, Kingfisher,

Cuckoo, Owls, Kestrel, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Merlin, Hobby, Osprey, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Martins (2), Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Shrikes, Magpie, Wheatear, Stonechat, Whinchat, Red Start, Fly Catchers, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Blackcap, Garden Warbler, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiff Chaff, White Throat, Lesser White Throat, Long-tailed Tit, Nuthatch, Wren, Gold Crested Wren, Wagtails (4), Hawfinch, Linnet, Buntings (3), Starling, Landrail or Corncrake, Coot, and Lapwing, Peewit, or Plover.
