THE following General Order, dated 6th May, 1898, publishing a Despatch from General Sir W. S. A. Lockhart, G.C.B., K.C.S.I., regarding the operations of the Tirah Expeditionary Force from the 27th January to the 5th April, 1898, has been received from the Government of India:—

FIELD ÓPERATIONS.—TIRAH.

No. 483. — THE Right Honourable the Governor-General in Council directs the publication, in continuation of G.G.O. Nos. 58 and 244 of 1898, of the subjoined letter from the Adjutant-General in India submitting a despatch from General Sir W. S. A. Lockhart, K.C.B., K.C.S.I., describing the operations of the Tirah Expeditionary Force from the 27th January to the 5th April, 1898.

2. His Excellency in Council agrees with His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief in his appreciation of the services of the officers named in the Adjutant-General's letter, and of the conduct of the troops during the period in question.

From Major-General G. de C. Morton, C.B., Adjutant-General in India, to the Secretary to the Government of India, Military Department, —No. 1086-F., "Field Operations—North-West Frontier," dated Simla, the 26th April, 1898.

IN continuation of this office No. 769-F, dated the 24th February, 1898, I have the honour, by direction of the Commander-in-Chief, to submit, for the information of the Government of India, the accompanying despatch from the General Officer Commanding the Tirah Expeditionary Force, describing the operations of the force from the 27th January to the 5th April, 1898.

2. The Commander-in Chief endorses the commendatory remarks made by General Sir William Lockhart on the services of Brigadier-General Ian Hamilton, C.B., D.S.O., commanding the 3rd Brigade, Brigadier-General J. W. Ottley, C.I.E., Commanding Royal Engineer of the Force, and others named in the despatch; as also the soldier-like conduct shown by the troops throughout the operations now reported.

No. 6373-T, dated Camp Peshawar, the 4th April, 1898, from General Sir W. S. A. Lockhart, K.C.B., K.C.S.I., Commanding the Tirah Expeditionary Force, to the Adjutant-General in India.

IN continuation of my letter No. 812-T-C,

dated the 26th January, 1898, I have the honour to submit, for the information of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief in India, the following account of the operations of the force under my command from January 27th, 1898, up to the present date.

2. As previously reported, after my return from the Bazar Valley, the troops at my disposal were distributed as follows:

1st Division.

1st Brigade at Ali Masjid. 2nd Brigade at Jamrud.

Sth Brigade (late Péshawar Column) at Landi Kotal

2nd Division.

3rd Brigade at Bara.

4th Brigade at Mamanai.

. To each brigade a portion of the divisional troops was attached.

The objects of this distribution were to occupy the Khyber and dominate the Bazar Valley, to threaten the winter settlements of the Afridis in the lower part of the Bara Valley and on the outskirts of the Kajurai Plain, and to enforce a strict blockade along the border line between British and tribal limits.

3. I may here mention that on January 17th a Jirga, representing the Malikdin Khel, Kambar Khel, Sipah, and Kamrai sections of the Afridis, arrived at Jamrud. But, though the delegates appeared to be submissive, and expressed their readiness to comply with the terms prescribed for their respective sections, no tangible proof of their sincerity was at first forthcoming; and meanwhile raiding parties from other sections in the hills continued to attack our outposts, intercept convoys, and destroy the telegraph line. Moreover, reports were received that a considerable number of cattle and camels belonging to those recalcitrant sections were being pastured in the Kajurai Plain. I therefore caused the Jirga to be informed that, until the Afridis assumed a more submissive attitude and evinced their readiness to collect the fines and surrender the rifles demanded from them, the presence of their representatives at Jamrud would not modify the existing state of war between the tribe and the Government of India. The justice of this decision was fully admitted by the Jirga.

4. On January 29th I proceeded from Rawal Pindi to Calcutta for the purpose of conferring with their Excellencies the Vicercy and the Commander-in Chief, returning to Peshawar on

February 7th.

On January 27th I received a report from the Political Officer at. Jamrud to the effect that a large number of cattle had been seen grazing on the Kajurai Plain, and I directed the General Officers Commanding the 1st and 2nd Divisions to take measures for their capture, the operations being under the control of Lieutenant - General Sir A. P. Palmer, K.C.B., as senior officer. On January 29th three columns were accordingly despatched at an early hour from Ali Masjid, Jamrud, and Mamanai to close the exits from the Kajurai Plain, except on the eastern side, where it adjoins British territory. A fourth column from Bara was directed to operate against such tribesmen as might be met with in the Plain, and seize their cattle. The column from Mamanai was the only one which came into contact with the enemy. It was composed of the 2nd Battalion, King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry, four companies of the 36th Sikhs, and two guns of No. 5 (Bombay) Mountain Battery, under the command of Lieutenant-Colonel T. J. Seppings, 2nd Battalion King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry. Starting

from Mamanai at 5 A.M., the tro ps reached the ! Shinkamar Kotal, without opposition at 10.30 A.M., and subsequently visited the caves a mile further on to the north. The caves were found to be deserted, and at 1 P.M., which was the hour fixed upon for the withdrawal to camp of all the columns employed, the force under Lieutenant-Colonel Seppings began its retirement from the Kotal. Owing to an order given by Lieutenant-Colonel J. Haughton, 36th Sikhs, being misunderstood, either by the native officer who received it, or by the native non-commissioned officer who conveyed it, a picquet of that regiment occupying a hill on the west, which commanded the road through the defile, was prematurely withdrawn. This bill was mediately seized by the tribesmen, who now began to show themselves, and, before the retirement cou'd be resumed, it was found necessary to retake it,—an operation which was only effected with considerable loss. The enemy, in rapidly increasing numbers, pressed on the western flank and rear of the troops, who were seriously encumbered by their dead and wounded, and inflicted still further loss on them. At 4.30 P.M. Brigadier-General Westmacott, commanding the 4th Brigade, who had received a heliogram from Lieutenant-Colonel Seppings, informing him of the state of affairs, brought up a reinforcement of three hundred rifles and two guns, thus enabling the column to return, without further loss, to Camp Mamanai, which was reached at 7 P.M. casualties on this day amounted to 5 British officers, 26 British soldiers, and 2 native soldiers, killed; and 3 British officers, 31 British solaiers, and 2 native soldiers, wounded. Among the killed the country has to deplore the loss of Lieutenant-Colonel Haughton, 36th Sikhs, an officer whose able and gallant leading of the fine regiment which he commanded had repeatedly come under my notice.

Only a few cattle were seen and captured by the other columns on January 29th, and this circumstance, added to the fact that the tribesmen concentrated their strength against the column from Mamanai, leads to the conclusion that, though the plan of operations was kept as secret as possible, it had become known to the enemy.

5. On January 31st a force of two thousand rifles from the 3rd and 4th Brigales, with No. 8 Mountain Battery, Royal Artillery, proceeded under Brigadier-General Westmacott's command to the Shinkamar Pass, for the purpose of recovering the bodies of such of the killed as the troops engaged on the 29th had been unable to remove.

This was accomplished without opposition being met with, but, during the withdrawal to camp, the enemy followed up the troops, of whom two officers and five men were wounded.

On this date 135 camels were captured on the Kajurai plain by a squadron of the 9th Bengal Lancers, which was well handled by Captain G. P. Brasier-Creagh.

6. On February 8th, after my return from Calcutta, I caused the Afridi Jirga assembled at Jamrud to be informed that the period within which the terms of Government must be complied with could not be extended beyond February 23rd, this being the date of the Id-i-Ramzan, and recommended as a suitable limit of time by my political advisers. I further intimated to the Jirga that, in the event of their several sections failing to submit by the day mentioned, active hostilities would be resumed; and that in the meantime the troops under my command would move in any direction I thought fit, and make

such roads as might be required for further operations.

7. On February 9th the 2nd Division was strengthened by the arrival of the 2nd Battalion, Royal Irish Regiment, from Rawal Pindi; and shortly afterwards six hundred Gurkha Scouts, drawn from the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Gurkhas, joined the force.

8. On February 12th Brigadier-General I. S. M. Hamilton, C.B., D.S.O., who a few days before had relieved Brigadier-General F. J. Kempster, D.S.O., in the command of the 3rd Brigade, advanced with the troops noted in the margin* to Barkai, four miles west of Mamanai; and on the 16th the construction of a road from Mamanai to Barkai and onwards towards Gali Khel, along the right bank of the Bara River, was begun. The improvement of the road from Ali Masjid towards Chora in the Bazar Valley was taken in hand at

the same time by the 1st Brigade. 9. As the Id approached, the weather became so stormy that communication between the Afridi representatives at Jamrud and their kinsmen in the hills was interrupted, and the collection of fines and rifles in the higher and more remote valleys of Tirah had to be suspended. In view of this fact, and of the evident anxiety of the Jirga to comply with the prescribed terms and thus escape a fresh invasion, I consented to an arrangement whereby the submission of each section should entitle the remaining sections to a few days of grace. The result has proved satisfactory, as up to the present date 754 serviceable breechloading rifles have been surrendered out of the total of 765 demanded, and Rs. 46,900 paid in out of the aggregate fine of Rs. 47,800. I anticipate that the remaining 11 rifles and Rs. 900, which are due from the Aka Khel, will be handed in within the next few days. Hostages have been taken from that section for the balance of the rifles and fine, and from every section for the restoration of the property captured or stolen during the late outbreak. The tribe has suffered so heavily that the final settlement may possibly be delayed for a few months, but I have every confidence that the claims which are still outstand-

ing will be fully met. Hostilities practically ceased on February 1st, ulthough a few raiders of the Khasrogi sub-section of the Zakka Khel attacked a picquet of the 3rd Brigade on the Lawata Hill, opposite Suikot, on March 11th, on which occasion Lieutenant H. J. de la Condamine and one soldier of the 1st Battalion, Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry, were wounded. A fortnight later a small band of marauders, belonging to the Shan sub-section of the Zakka Khel, fired on some officers and men returning from Mamanai to Barkai, and wounded Captain Margesson, 1st Battalion, Norfolk Regiment, and two soldiers of the 1st Battalion, Gordon Highlanders. These incidents are to be regretted, but they were unavoidable from a military point of view and of no political significance.

The Afridis are now most desirous of resuming their former friendly relations with the British Government, and admit that the recent operations in Tirah have convinced them of the folly of their unprovoked attack on the Khyber and Samana posts and other hostile acts. They express con-

trition for their misconduct, and acknowledge the justice of their punishment. I trust that these tribesmen, who have proved themselves as brave foes as the Sikhs did, may, like the latter, become our firm friends. No finer fighting material can be found on the borders of India; and if, by firm yet sympathetic treatment, we succeed in gaining the confidence and affection of these hardy mountaineers, we may hope to utilize their services more fully than before in the defence of the Empire.

10. In bringing this narrative to a close, I would wish to record my appreciation of the soldier-like behaviour of the troops under my command, not only while actively engaged in the field, but also while employed on the tedious and monotonous duties of a blockade. Their conduct during the second phase of the campaign has been as creditable as were their gallantry and endurance during the first. The force can congratulate itself on having carried out, in the most thorough manner, the task entrusted to it. In no previous campaign on the North-West Frontier of India has a more exemplary punishment bren inflicted, or a more complete submission enforced.

11. In conclusion, I have to record my obligations to Brigadier-General I. S. M. Hamilton, C.B., D.S.O., Commanding the 3rd Brigade, who has performed his duties with marked ability and energy; also to Brigadier-General J. W. Ottley, C.I.E., who has rendered valuable service as Commanding Royal Engineer of the Force, more particularly in connection with the improvement of communications and the restoration of the Khyber posts.

12. During the period dealt with in this despatch the following officers have been brought to my notice as deserving of favourable mention:

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the copy of a Notice issued by Her Majesty's Consul-General for Siam, viz. NOTICE.

Whereas, an epidemic of bubonic plague has broken out in Hongkong, and it appears desirable, as a matter of urgency, to take precautions in order to prevent the spread of the same to the Kingdom of Siam, until such time as that port shall have been declared free from plague:

The undersigned, Her Britannic Majesty's Consul-General for Siam, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred upon him by section 84 of Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated the 26th day of November, 1889, has made the following Regulation for the peace, order, and good Government of Her Majesty's subjects being within the dominions of the King of Siam:—

Regulation:
1. The Island of Koh Phai shall be, and is hereby declared the Quarantine and Inspection Station for the purposes of the present regulation.

2. Any vessel which having cleared from Hongkong, arrives in Siamese waters, on or after the date of the present regulation shall call at the said station, and shall, before receiving pratique, stay there until a period of nine full days shall have elapsed from the time of her leaving Hongkong.

3. Any vessel which, having cleared from any Chinese port, arrives in Siamese waters on or after the date of the present regulation shall call at the said station, and shall stay there until such time as the Health Officer shall have boarded her

and given her pratique.

4. No person other than the Health Officer, or one of his assistants, shall communicate from any ship coming from Hongkong, or any Chinese port with the land, or from the land with such ship, or from such ship with other ships, before she has

received pratique.

5. The Master, or other person having the control of any vessel in quarantine, shall give the Health Officer such information about the vessel and the voyage, and the health of the crew and pas engers and otherwise as the Health Officer may require, and shall answer fully and truly questions put to him by the Health Officer, and shall if required by the Health Officer furnish the necessary boats and appliances for the landing of passengers or crew at the Quarantine Station and shall in a general way, give the Health Officer all necessary assistance to enable him to grant pratique to the vessel.

pratique to the vessel.

6. The Health Officer may board any vessel arriving in Siamese waters and inspect every person in the vessel. He may, if he thinks necessary, call for inspection of the ship's bills of health, emigration papers or other documents which he may require to enable him to grant pratique, and he shall use every lawful means which to him may seem expedient for ascertaining the sanitary condition of the vessel and persons

therein.
7. No Customs Officer on duty at Koh-si-Chang or at Paknam shall allow any ship coming from Hongkong, or any Chinese port, either to lighten at Koh-si-Chang or to proceed to Bangkok without producing the Certificate of Health delivered at Koh Pbai, but all said ships which shall produce such certificates shall be at liberty to lighten at Koh-si-Chang, and to proceed to Bangkok or elsewhere without any further examination.

8. The Health Officer shall be and is hereby empowered to deal with all infected vessels and persons as he may think proper to prevent the spreading of the disease.

9. Any and all persons committing a breach of

the present regulation or assisting in any way in the commission of such breach and the Master; Captain or other person having the control of any vessel or boat, on board of which such breach has been committed or which has been in any way engaged in the commission of such breach, shall be severally liable to a fine not exceeding £100, or to imprisonment not exceeding three months, or to both such punishments.

10. Any cost incurred by the Siamese Government, in the maintenance of any person removed to the Quarantine Station at Koh Phai, shall be

repaid by the agents of the vessel.
