THE Queen, taking into Her Royal consideration that, upon the decease of Sir John Strange Jocelyn, Earl of Roden, of High Roding, in the county of Tipperary, in the Peerage of Ireland, Baron Clanbrassill, of Hyde Hall, in the county of Hertford, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, a Baronet of England, which happened on the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, the dignity of Earl of Roden devolved upon William Henry Jocelyn, now Earl of Roden, as eldest son and heir of John Jocelyn, Esquire (commonly called the Honourable John Jocelyn), who at the time of his death was heir presumptive to the dignity of Earl of Roden, whereby, according to the ordinary rules of honour, the brother of the said William Henry, now Earl of Roden, cannot enjoy that place, rank, and precedence which would have been due to him had his father, the said John Jocelyn, survived the said John Strange, Earl of Roden, and thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Roden, has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Robert Julian Orde Jocelyn, Esquire, a Major (with the honorary rank of Lieutenant-Colonel) on the Retired List of Her Majesty's Army, the brother of the said William Henry, now Earl of Roden, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if his late father, John Jocelyn, had survived the said John Strange, late Earl of Roden, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Roden :

And to command that the said Order and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following copy of a Notice issued by the Marine Board at Trieste respecting the precautions to be taken against the introduction of plague :—

Circular No. 5853 of the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste to all Imperial and Royal Offices and Officers and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Offices and Officers,

By Decree of the 27th May, 1898, issued by the High Imperial and Royal Ministries of the Interior of Commerce and Finance (B:L.I. No. 90), in conjunction with the Hungarian Government, on account of the existence of the Bubonic plague in Asia, the importation and transit of the following articles is prohibited from the Island of Formosa, and from the ports of Amoy, Swatow, Hong Kong, Canton, and Macao, as well as from those ports of the littoral of British India, and towards the westward to the entrance of the Suez Canal in the Gulf of Suez :

(1.) Of used body linen clothes, of old clothing (personal effects), old bed clothing, when such articles are forwarded as personal baggage or as household effects in consequence of change of residence, they are subject upon passing the frontier to special regulations and treatment by the sanitary police.

(2.) Of rags and tatters, not excluding rags

compressed by hydraulic power, which are packed in closed bales as articles of commerce.

(3.) Of used sackings, carpets and used embroideries.

(4.) Of raw uncalcined hides, unprepared and green.

(5.) Of animal substances, raw and unprepared, as bones, hoofs, bladders and intestines, if sent separate from the carcasses, also of hides and horse hair.

(6.) Of hair.

Permission will be granted for transit of the goods enumerated when proof is forthcoming that if such goods have passed through infected territory, they have done so packed in such a manner as has rendered infection impossible.

This Order comes into force on the day that it is received respectively by the Customs House Offices, and by the Marine Sanitary Offices.

At the same time the Decrees of January 24, February 18 and July 31, 1897 (B.L.I. 29, 54 and 180), published in the Government circulars of January 27, February 21, and August 4, 1897, Nos. 1122, 2080, and 8532, are cancelled.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 dated the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture have hereunto set their Official Seal this sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

No. 316.—INDIA—WEST COAST.

*Intended Changes in Cahp, Mangalore, and
Manapad Lights.*

THE Indian Government have given notice,
dated 26th April, 1898, that the following new
lights will be exhibited and alterations made in the
undermentioned existing lights, the exact dates of
which will be made known by subsequent
notices:—

1. *Cahp*.—A new light will be established at
Cahp. It will be a group flashing white light
showing three flashes every ten seconds, elevated
140 feet above high water, and visible in clear
weather from a distance of 18 miles. The light-
house, white masonry, will be erected on a rock
near the Cahp Battery in ruins.

Approximate position, lat. $13^{\circ} 13\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long.
 $74^{\circ} 43\frac{1}{2}'$ E.

2. *Mangalore*.—A new light will be established
at Mangalore. It will be a fixed white light,
elevated 33 feet above high water, and visible in
