NOTICES TO MARINERS.

(Nos. 316 to 329 of the year 1898.)

[The bearings are magnetic, and those concerning
 the visibility of lights are given from seaward.]

No. 316.—INDIA—WEST COAST.

*Intended Changes in Cahp, Mangalore, and
 Manapad Lights.*

THE Indian Government have given notice,
 dated 26th April, 1898, that the following new
 lights will be exhibited and alterations made in the
 undermentioned existing lights, the exact dates of
 which will be made known by subsequent
 notices:—

1. Cahp.—A new light will be established at
 Cahp. It will be a group flashing white light
 showing three flashes every ten seconds, elevated
 140 feet above high water, and visible in clear
 weather from a distance of 18 miles. The light-
 house, white masonry, will be erected on a rock
 near the Cahp Battery in ruins.

Approximate position, lat. 13° 13½' N., long.
 74° 43½' E.

2. Mangalore.—A new light will be established
 at Mangalore. It will be a fixed white light,
 elevated 33 feet above high water, and visible in
 clear weather from a distance of 11 miles. It will
 be exhibited from a white masonry tower to be
 erected on the southern part of Marine Yard,
 Mangalore.

Approximate position, lat. 12° 50¼' N., long.
 74° 49½' E.

3. On the exhibition of Cahp Light, the light
 (fixed white) now shown at Mangalore will be
 discontinued, but the tower will remain.

4. Manapad Light will be altered to a group
 flashing white light, showing two flashes every ten
 seconds, elevated 140 feet above high water, and
 visible in clear weather from a distance of 18
 miles.

This light will be shown from a new white
 masonry lighthouse, now constructing on Manapad
 Point, and on the exhibition of the new light, the
 present light (fixed red) will be discontinued and
 the tower removed.

Approximate position, lat. 8° 22½' N., long.
 78° 3½' E.
