- GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering Regulations as to Signature of Orders drawn by Guardians upon Treasurer :-

Parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell. To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell ;-

And to all others whom it may concern. WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 8th day of December, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell, amongst others, the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Rules and Regulations relating to the administration of relief to the Poor within the said Parish, and by Article 84 of the said Order directed that the Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish should pay every sum greater than Five Pounds by an order drawn upon their Treasurer and signed by the presiding Chairman and two other Guardians at a meeting, and countersigned by the Clerk;

And whereas by a General Order dated the 7th day of April, 1857, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish, amongst others, the Poor Law Board prescribed the Form in which such orders should be drawn by the said

Guardians upon their Treasurer;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision in the matter should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, by this Our Order direct that, so far as the above-cited General Orders relate to the said Parish of Saint Giles. Camberwell, the said Article 84 of the said General Order dated the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, shall be altered by the substitution of the words "three Guardians" for the words "the presiding Chairman and two other Guardians" occurring therein, and the said Form prescribed by the said General Order dated the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, shall be altered by omitting therefrom the words "Presiding Chairman," and by making the words "Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish" therein apply to the three Guardians signing the order on the Treasurer.
