At the Entrance of the Abbey (within the West Door) the Dean and Prebendaries, with the Choir, joined the Procession immediately before the Earl Marshal; the Choir singing the Opening Sentences, to Dr. Croft's music, as the Procession passed towards the Sacrarium, where the Clergy and Choir took their places (the Choir remaining in the Sacrarium throughout the Service). On arrival under the Lantern the Chief Mourner was seated on a chair at the head of the Coffin, the Supporters of the Pall on chairs on either side, and the Relatives took their places in the seats reserved for them.

Psalm xc was chanted to *Thomas Purcell's* Funeral Chant.

The Lesson having been read, the Hymn "Rock of Ages" was sung, and the Coffin was then moved to the Grave, whilst the Hymn "Praise to the Holiest" was sung.

The Coffin was then laid into the earth, the Dean saying the appointed Sentences, and after the Burial the words of "Committal to the Ground."

"I heard a Voice from Heaven," music by Sir John Goss, was then sung, and was followed by the Lesser Litany and the Lord's Prayer.

The concluding Prayer and Collect of the Burial Service was then said, and the following Anthem sung:—Eccles. xlv, 14, "Their bodies are buried in peace, but their name liveth evermore."—*Handel*.

After "The Grace" had been pronounced, Norroy, representing Garter King of Arms, proclaimed the style of the Deceased, as follows:—

"Thus it hath pleased Almighty God to take out of this transitory life, unto His Divine mercy, the Right Honourable William Ewart Gladstone, one of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, sometime First Lord Commissioner of the Treasury, Lord Privy Seal, Chancellor and Under Treasurer of the Exchequer, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, President of the Board of Trade, Lord High Commissioner Extraordinary to the Ionian Islands."

The ceremony of Interment being ended, the Mourners, the Members of the Royal Family, the Representatives of Foreign Sovereigns, and others having left the Abbey, a Procession of the Peers and Members of the House of Commons was then re-formed and conducted by the Officers of Arms to the respective Houses of Parliament.
