HER Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Minister at Berne, a Despatch, recommending strongly that all British subjects who are proceeding to Switzerland, including minors who, unaccompanied by their parents, are going thither for educational purposes, should be provided with Foreign Office passports. The production merely of a certificate of birth or baptism will not be sufficient under present regulations to obtain from the local authorities the "permis de séjour" or ticket of residence, without which no foreigner is allowed to remain in a Canton.
