Ordonnance No. 214.

Conformément à la décision du Conseil Sanitaire Supérieur prise le 2 Juin courant, à la suite de l'apparition de deux cas de peste à Clazomène, j'ordonne.

1. Interdire l'entrée en Bulgarie des pèlerins musulmans qui sont partis en pèlerinage malgré l'arrêté du Conseil des Ministres en date du 23 Décembre 1897, arrêté qui a été communiqué par la dépêche circulaire du 24 même mois, sous le No. 6021.

2. Interdire également l'entrée des effets de ces pèlerins, qui seraient expédiés soit partiellement soit en ballots ou comme marchandises.

- 3. Si quelques-uns de ces pèlerins franchissent clandestinement la frontière, en quelque endroit où ils seraient arrêtés par les autorités de police frontières, ils doivent être immédiatement isolés et tenus sous la plus sévère surveillance jusqu'à nouvel ordre de la part du Conseil Supérieur Les vêtements et effets de ces per-Sanitaire. sonnes doivent être de suite soumis à la désinfection.
- 4. Les autorités de Police frontières doivent contrôler d'une manière très-rigoureuse les passeports et teskérés des voyageurs, afin de constater si les détenteurs de ces documents sont ou non des pèlerins. Tous pèlerins, à leur arrivée, doivent être immédiatement renvoyés en arrière.

BEING officially informed of the appearance of the Bubonic plague in various parts of the South Coast of Asia, the Federal Government, in accordance with your proposal, has determined

1. To declare infected the ports of Hong Kong,

Canton, and Macao.

2. To declare suspected, not only all the ports on the borders of the river Canton, but also the other ports of the Sea of China comprised between that of Amoy and the peninsula Lei Tcheon Fou.

3. To consider the above declarations in force against all ships proceeding from such ports after

the 17th of May ultimo.

It shall be the duty of the party appealing to apply to the judge of the county court for a signed copy of the note made by him of any question of law raised before him, and of the facts in evidence in relation thereto, and of his decision thereon, and of his decision on the question or matter submitted to him, and to furnish such copy for the use of the Court

of Appeal; and such copy shall be used and received at the hearing of the appeal. If such notes are not produced the Court of Appeal shall have power to hear and determine the appeal upon any other evidence or statement of what occurred before the judge of the county court which the Court of Appeal may deem sufficient.

(c.) Order LIX Rules 14 and 16 shall apply to any such appeal, with the substitution of the Court of Appeal for the High Court.

(d.) Subject to the foregoing provisions, the rules for the time being in force with respect to appeals from the High Court to the Court of Appeal shall, so far as practicable, apply to and govern appeals under the said Act to the Court of Appeal.

5. These Rules may be cited as the Rules of the Supreme Court, July, 1898, or separately according to their respective headings, with reference to the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1883; and they shall come into operation on the 24th day of October 1898.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
