

Dovetief, has formed in Norderney Gat, and the buoys in that gat have been moved as follows to mark Dovetief:—

1. The leading buoy (red and named Dovetief) has been moved to the westward and is now moored in approximately lat. $53^{\circ} 44' 55''$ N., long. $7^{\circ} 7' 30''$ E.

2. The conical black buoy has been moved to the west-south-westward and is now moored in approximately latitude $53^{\circ} 44' 20''$ N., longitude $7^{\circ} 8' 5''$ E.

3. The can buoy A (red) has been moved to the south-westward and is now moored in approximately lat. $53^{\circ} 44' 0''$ N., long. $7^{\circ} 8' 5''$ E.

No. 369.—JAPAN—SETO UCHI.

(1.) *Takamatsu Approach—Dangers South-Westward of O Sima.*

THE Japanese Government has given notice of the existence of a sunken rock, locally named Gingoro Iwa, with a least depth of $1\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms on it, situated in a position with the south-west point of O Sima bearing E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., distant $3\frac{1}{10}$ cables; and Ya Sima No Hana Centre S. $\frac{3}{4}$ W.

Approximate position, lat. $34^{\circ} 24' 5''$ N., long. $134^{\circ} 5' 5''$ E.

A sandy shoal, with depths of less than 4 fathoms on it, stretches nearly 4 cables south-westward from Gingoro Iwa.

A rock, named Game Iso, with a depth of 2 feet on it, and shoal water half a cable eastward, lies E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., distant $1\frac{3}{4}$ cables, from Gingoro Iwa.

(2.) *Bingo Nada—Rocks near Awa Sima.*

Also, of the existence of the undermentioned rocks near Awa Sima, east end of Bingo Nada:—

a. A rock, named Nabe Iso, with a depth of one foot on it, and steep to, except to the southward, in a position with summit northward of Takuma (440) bearing S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., distant $5\frac{1}{10}$ cables; and Summit (914), south-west of Koda, S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

Approximate position, lat. $34^{\circ} 14' 35''$ N., long. $133^{\circ} 38' 55''$ E.

b. Three rocks, close together, named Mitsu Boshi, the highest of which dries 2 feet at low water, with deep water to the southward, in a position with Awa Sima South Point (the western) bearing east, distant one cable; or approximately in lat. $34^{\circ} 15' 25''$ N., long. $133^{\circ} 36' 50''$ E.
