THE Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Hugh Lupus, Duke of Westminster, K.G., Her Majesty's Royal licence and authority that his Grace may accept and wear the Insignia of the Order of the Saviour, which decoration His Majesty the King of the Hellenes has been pleased to confer upon his Grace in recognition of his philanthropic work in Greece after the recent Greeo-Turkish War.

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to grant unto Owen Howard Tripp, of Homehurst, in the parish of Beckenham, in the county of Kent, Gentleman, eldest son of Henry Tripp, Clerk in Holy Orders, Rector of Winford, in the county of Somerset, Master of Arts in the University of Oxford, and sometime Fellow of Worcester College in the University aforesaid, who was eldest son of Charles Tripp, Clerk in Holy Orders, Rector of Silverton, in the county of Devon, Doctor of Divinity of the University of Cambridge and in the Commission of the Peace for the said counties of Somerset and Devon, by Frances, his wife, sister and eventual sole heir of Sir William Owen-Barlow, of Lawrenny, in the county of Pembroke, Baronet, Barrister-at-Law, and Bencher of the Middle Temple, and daughter of William Owen, Brigadier-General in the Army and Colonel of the 61st Regiment of Foot, by Anne, his wife, daughter of John Tripp, of Huntspill and Taunton, in the county of Somerset aforesaid, Barrister-at-Law, who was grandfather of the said Charles Tripp, all deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that he may take and use the surname of Owen in lieu of that of Tripp, and may take and bear the arms of Owen only, and that such surname and arms may in like manner be borne and used by his issue; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 to 1896, and upon application from the Council of the County Borough of Croydon, I hereby make the following Order:-

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Croydon) Order, July 1898."

#### II. BIRDS.

(1.) Close Time Extended.

The time during which the killing and taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended, so far as concerns the County Borough of Croydon, so as to be from the 1st February to the 31st August in every year.

(3.) Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 shall apply within the County Borough of Croydon to the Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Martins (2), Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Shrikes, Kestiel, Merlin, Hobby, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Ospiey, Magpie, and Chaffinch, as if those species were included in the Schedule to the said Act.
