FIELD OPERATIONS.—MEKRAN.

No. 648.—THE Right Honourable the Governor-General in Council is pleased to direct the publication of the subjoined letter from the Adjutant-General in India, dated the 20th May, 1898, submitting, under the orders of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief in India, a Despatch from Major (temporary Lieutenant-Colonel) R. C. G. Mayne, Commandant of the 30th Bombay Infantry and Commanding the troops in Mekran, reporting the particulars of the operations of the detachment under his command in Mekran in January and February last.

From Major-General G. De C. Morton, C.B., Adjutant-General in India, to the Secretary to the Government of India, Military Department,—(No. 2250-A,—"Disturbances,"—dated Simla, the 20th May, 1898).

I HAVE the honour, by direction of the Commander-in-Chief, to submit, for the consideration of the Government of India, the accompanying letter from the Lieutenant-General Commanding the Forces, Bombay, enclosing a Despatch from Lieutenant-Colonel R. C. G. Mayne, 30th Bombay Infantry, describing the operations of the troops which recently proceeded under his command to Mekran, for the purpose of quelling the disturb-

ance which had taken place there.

2. His Excellency fully concurs in the remarks made by Lieutenant-General Duncan, and considers that great credit is due to Lieutenant-Colonel Mayne and the officers and troops employed, for the creditable manner in which the operations were carried out. Lieutenant-Colonel Mayne's skilful dispositions during the action at Gok Parosh, and the gallantry shown by the small body of troops under his command against large numbers of the enemy, who were completely routed, are deserving of special mention, especially as this is the first time the 30th Bombay Infantry has been employed on active service.

3. The Commander-in-Chief endorses the commendation bestowed by Lieutenant-Colonel Mayne

on the officers named in the despatch, and also desires to bring to the notice of Government the promptitude with which all arrangements for the despatch of the force were made by Brigadier-General T. A. Cooke, Commanding the Sind District, the Staff of that District, and the regimental authorities.

From Lieutenant-General J. Duncan, Lieutenant-General Commanding the Forces, Bombay, to the Adjutant-General in India,—(No. 1043-A-M, "Field Operations-Mekran-Despatches," dated Mahableshwar, the 9th May, 1898)

I HAVE the honour to forward, for the information of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief in India, a letter* from Lieutenant-Colonel Mayne, submitting a report on the operations conducted by him in Mekran, from the 13th January to about the middle of February, 1898.

2. I desire to bring to notice, for His Excellency's favourable consideration, the skill and vigour with which these operations were successfully carried out by Lieutenant-Colonel Mayne, in the face of considerable difficulties and with a comparatively small force.

From Lieutenant-Colonel R. C. G. Mayne, Commanding the 30th Bombay Infantry and the troops in Mekran, to the Deputy Adjutant-General, Bombay Command, Poona,—(dated Karachi, the 12th April, 1898).

I HAVE the honour to submit, for the information of His Excellency the Lieutenant-General Commanding the Troops, Bombay Command, the accompanying report of the operations in Mekran.

2. A further detailed diary of the expedition and reports on the roads traversed will be forwarded if required, but there will be some little delay in doing so, as the regiment under my command is on the move to Chaman, and there is a press of work.

Report on the Operations in Mekran.

On the 11th January, 1898, orders were given me by Brigadier-General T. A. Cooke, Commanding the Sind District, to embark the same evening for Ormara with 250 rifles of the 30th Bombay Infantry (3rd Baluch Battalion), with the object of relieving that place, which was in danger of being attacked by Sardar Baluch Khan, Chief

of Kolwa, who had a few days previously treacherously attacked Captain Burn's survey party at Hor Kalat, looted his camp, and killed

some of the survey party.

The force disembarked on the 13th January, and further orders were received at Ormara to ensure, if possible, the safety of the Europeans and natives of the survey party. The same afternoon Captain A. Le G. Jacob, with 100 rifles, was despatched to the Basol River, where the Pasni, Balor and Chambor roads meet, and from where he was in a position to render assistance to the survey party. In the meantime every endeayour was made to collect camels, for a forward move. It was, however, impossible to collect more than a few, as Sardar Mehrab Khan (Gitchki) and Baluch Khan had sent messengers with orders to make camel-owners drive all camels away from the coast, with a view to making any advance impossible. However, Captain M. A. Tighe, Political Agent, South-East Baluchistan, quickly made arrangements for providing camels from Las Beyla, and I am much indebted to this officer for the help he gave me. Had it not been for his personal exertions, I much doubt if these camels would ever have reached me at Pasni. In the course of the next few days Lieutenant H. H. Turner, Royal Engineers, and Messrs. Hickie and Prunty and refugee khalassis of the survey party came dropping in.

The aspect of affairs had now changed considerably, and it was evident that a rising had taken place in the Kej Valley. Orders were received sanctioning my advance to the relief of the Nazim of Kej, who was with some loyal Sarlars shut up in the Kalatak Fort. Native reports at this time stated that Baluch Khan aud Mehrab Khan would oppose our advance. Captain Tighe, Political Agent, South - East Baluchistan, and Lieutenant S. G. Knox, Political Agent, Kalat, had now both joined me, the latter officer accompanying me as political officer to the

force.

With the survey-party camels and a few that had been collected, a move was made on the 19th January to Pasni (100 miles west). The march was attended with considerable difficulty, as most of the camels were very weakly and broke down; however, female camels and young camels which had never been loaded were caught on the march and utilized.

Pasni was reached on the 25th, where I found that Captain R. Southey, with 120 rifles of the 30th Bombay Infantry and two guns of No. 4 (Hazara) Mountain Battery, under Lieutenant J. H. Paine had arrived,—eight more rifles, 60 sabres of the 6th Bombay Cavalry, and a detachment of sappers and miners also being en route to join me from India

On the 27th January my force, consisting of two guns and 300 rifles (with ten days' supplies) started for the relief of the Nazim of Kej, who was reported to be in a critical position, still at Kalatak Fort, with food-supplies that would only

last till the 9th February.

During the advance constant rumours came in, stating that Mehrab Khan and Baluch Khan had joined forces, and would attack us at night. Instructions were sent by me to the Nazim, and to thé loyal Sardars not to abandon the fort, if they could remain there with safety, and that I would reach Turbat on the 31st January.

Every precaution was taken against night attacks, but the march was uneventful until the morning of the 31st, when, at about 8 A.M., while on the march, the enemy were suddenly sighted on the hills overlooking the plain, Fazl Shah's party.

evidently with the object of holding the pass. was able to ascertain the general position of the enemy, which appeared a very strong one, and to estimate their strength, as they remained standing upon the position.

An advance was immediately made with the object of seizing two small hills facing the right centre of the enemy's position, which were the

only available positions for my artillery.

The advanced guard, under Lieutenant N. R. Anderson, was ordered to advance as far as possible, and Captain Jacob, with 50 rifles, was detached to occupy a hill on the enemy's left flank, which appeared to me to slightly command their position; 100 rifles were left as baggage and rear-guard, and would have been used as a reserve if necessary, and 150 rifles and two guns remained for the main attack.

At about 8.30 a.m., on passing the low hills, the advanced guard came under a heavy fire from the enemy, and it was evident that the enemy were in possession of a considerable number of breech-loaders, as at 850 yards bullets were passing over the heads of the main body.

The advanced guard at once engaged the enemy, and the guns and infantry rapidly occupied the near hill. The guns at once commenced shelling the main position, the infantry directing their fire on the enemy's right centre, which appeared most strongly occupied. Captain Jacob came into action just about this time, and appeared to be

strongly opposed.

I was now able to make out the enemy's position, which was clearly defined. Hills from 100 to 300 feet high commanded the road on either side; the main position was a sharp ridge about 80 to 100 feet high with a very steep ascent, commanding the plain; the enemy's left flank ran back slightly; the western side of the road, their right flank, which was very weakly occupied, was commanded by some low spurs which ran out of the hills at nearly a right angle to the front; to the rear of these were hills 100 to 300 feet high.

It was evident that any direct attack on such a strong position with my small force would certainly be attended with severe loss, and was difficult and dangerous. I determined to leave a small containing force to hold the enemy's right centre, and to try and seize the low spurs, which, once in our possession, would enable me to

enfilade the enemy's main position.

Captain Southey was despatched with 50 rifles to carry out the turning movement. As he approached the hills, the enemy rapidly filled up the hills to oppose his advance. The hills thus occupied had to be gradually cleared. At this juncture Lieutenant H. T. Naylor with 32 sabres of the 6th Bombay Cavalry appeared on the scene, having joined me by double marches from Pasni. I despatched Lieutenant Naylor to assist on Captain Southey's left, and ordered Captain Southey to close in towards the pass, at the same time sending Jemadar Fazl Shah with another 50 rifles to attack the low spurs. Just prior to this the artillery position was changed to the small hill on my left, which enabled me to command the road up the pass, and also the ground between the low spurs and the enemy's main position.

The artillery from here opened a rapid and continuous fire on the low spurs, and the enemy's right flank came under a very severe fire from Captain Southey in rear of them, Jemadar Fazl Shah endlading them, and a frontal fire from the guns. The enemy rapidly evacuated this position, which was at once occupied by Jemadar

In the meantime Captain Jacob, who had been working round very cleverly, had succeeded in establishing himself in a similar position on the left of the enemy's main position. On moving across to the low spurs, I found that the right flank of the enemy were completely cut off from their main body, and were in full flight, and that the main position which was still held, was enfiladed on the right.

The enemy had by this time lost heavily, and commenced shortly to evacuate the main position. The guns followed smartly up into the firing line, and fired case. The original containing force of infantry under Lieutenant Anderson had now cleared and occupied the main ridge, and the action terminated suddenly at about 11 A.M., bands of fugitives being shelled as they fled across the hills. There was no time to ascertain the enemy's loss, as we had yet to go through the pass (which was six miles through), and I estimated it roughly at about 100 killed; however, from subsequent enquiries from the inhabitants and from those who were on the ground the next day, there was no doubt but that the enemy lost from 200 to 250 killed and about the same number of wounded. Their dead were left on the field. Their strength was about 1,500 fighting men and 500 followers. Many rifles, jezzils and swords were captured, as well as some horses, ponies and camels.

Amongst their killed were the following chiefs

of note:-

Baluch Khan (Nosharwani), Chief of Kolwa and their General,

Mehrab Khan (Nosharwani), Chief of Bolida, Shakroola Khan (Gitchki), Chief of Tump, Haiatan Khan (Rind), Chief of Wakhai, Gul Muhammad Khan (Nosharwani), of Bolida,

and other minor chiefs.

Our losses were as under:-

6th Bombay Cavalry-Wounded, 1.

No. 4 (Hazara) Mountain Battery—Killed, 1; Wounded, 1.

30th Bombay Infantry—Killed, 2; Wounded, 10.*

Surgeon-Captain E. G. R. Whitcombe, with his hospital-assistants, was up in the firing line from the commencement of the action, tending the wounded.

The advance was resumed at 11.45 A.M., and no further opposition was met with in the pass. On clearing the pass the cavalry pressed on, under orders to reach the river and cut off the fugitives. On reaching the River Kej, they were fired on, and killed four and wounded five of the enemy. In the meantime the main body advanced on Turbat. On approaching Turbat fort, at about 4.30 P.M., a desultory fire was opened on the column from the fort. As the troops had had two long and tiring days, I considered it sufficient to drop a few shell into the fort, and reached camp at about 5.30 P.M.

Where all did well it is difficult to particularize; but I would give especial mention to Licutenant Paine and Jemadar Shaikh Khuda Baksh of No. 4 (Hazara) Mountain Battery, to Captains Southey and Jacob, Subadar Ahmad Khan and Jemadar Fazl Shah, all of the 30th Bombay Infantry. The perfect drill, steadiness, and discipline of the battery was admirable, while the ready and gallant way the infantry scaled the steep hills under fire, and cleared ridge after ridge was most praiseworthy. Lieutenant Naylor; and the 6tl. Bombay Cavalry worked with great dash throughs out the day.

Terms were offered to and refused by Mehrab Khan (Gitchki), who abandoned Turbat Fort during the night of the 2nd February, the fort having been shelled that morning.

It was intended to blow up and assault the fort on the morning of the 3rd, on the arrival of the detachment of the Bombay Sappers and Miners, under Lieutenant W. Bovet, who arrived on the evening of the 2nd, having marched forty miles that day. It is worthy of note that the same detachment marched thirty miles to Charbak Fort the next day, thus completing seventy miles in forty-eight hours. A forced march was made to Charbak Fort by the force on the night of the 3rd and the fort surrounded, information having been received that some of the enemy had taken refuge there, and the tower of the fort was blown up. The force returned on the 7th, and the next few days were occupied in blowing up the forts of Gushtang, Kaor-i-Kalat and Kala-i-Nao, the villages close to them having been burnt on the 2nd February.

It now remained to visit the different valleys, to see if any further opposition was to be expected, and to restore confidence among the people. A flying column under Major G. E. Even was despatched to Bolida, where the forts of Chib and Koshk were blown up, and Bet Fort taken possession of. On its return, the main column under my command proceeded to Tump; the fort was surrendered and occupied by us, as well as the fort of Phulabad, which was blown up on the return journey. The force now proceeded to Mand, close to the Persian frontier. The various headmen and chiefs who had been summoned to attend having all come in, the return journey was commenced. At Turbat, prior to the final move to Kolwa, fines amounting to Rs. 50,000 were imposed on the different chiefs by Lieutenaut Knox.

Kolwa (120 miles east) was now visited, and the forts at Sharak, Nag, Ser, and Hor Kalat were blown up. Hor Kalat was the property of Baluch Khan, and was the scene of the treacherous attack on Captain Burn's camp.

The expedition having now successfully accomplished its work, returned to India, one portion returning via Kalat and Quetta, and the remainder via Balor, Ormara and Karachi.

Provision for the security, after our departure, of the Kej, Tump, and Bolida valleys was provided for by garrisoning Turbat, Kalatak, Tump, and Bet Forts with all available Kalat State troops, and a detachment of the 30th Bombay Infantry.

Altogether this teen forts were blown up, and large quantities of crops belonging to the Chiefs who opposed us were consumed; also a considerable number of fines were imposed. The inhabitants of the country were not allowed to appear armed in the vicinity of our troops.

Confidence was restored, and the combination of which Mehrab Khan and Baluch Khan were the head was thoroughly broken up.

I would, in addition to the names of those officers whom I have especially mentioned in the account of the action of Gok Parosh, bring to notice the names of the following officers who afforded me every assistance during the expedition:—
