WHEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means, Her Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the limits comprised in the Uganda Protectorate:

And whereas under the Africa Orders in Council 1889 and 1892 "The Land Acquisition Act 1894," an Act of the Governor-General of India in Council, has been applied to the Uganda Protectorate:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for the vesting of lands taken for public purposes under the provisions of the said Act:

Now therefore, Her Majesty by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act 1890" or otherwise in Her Majesty vested is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. Any lands whereof possession has been or shall after the passing of this Order be taken for public purposes within the Uganda Protectorate under the provisions of the said "Land Acquisition Act 1894," shall vest absolutely in the Commissioner and Consul-General and his successors in office for the time being, in trust for Her Majesty, or if the Secretary of State at any time or in any case by Order under his hand so directs, in such other trustee or trustees for Her Majesty, as the Secretary of State may appoint.

2. The Secretary of State may when he thinks fit by a like Order remove any trustee so appointed, and may appoint any new or additional trustee or trustees.

3. This Order shall be read and construed with the Africa Orders in Council 1889 and 1892 and may be cited as the Africa (Acquisition of Lands) Order in Council 1898.

And the Most Honourable the Marquess of Salisbury, K.G., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

PURSUANT to the twention section of "The Land Transfer Act, 1897," Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, with respect to the County of London, as follows:—

Registration of title to land is to be compulsory on sale in the several portions of the county mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto, on and after the respective days mentioned in the second column of the same Schedule.

In this Order "parish" means a place for which a separate poor-rate is or can be made, or for which a separate overseer is or can be

appointed, and the boundaries of each such parish shall be those constituted and limited at the date of this Order.

This Order may be amended or added to or repealed by Order in Council.

WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," it is (among other things) enacted that Her Majesty may by Order in Council fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities on account of the services of lighthouses, buoys, and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of these establishments, and that no increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas Her Majesty by Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, was pleased to fix the engineering establishment which might be maintained by the Corporation of Trinity House, of Deptford Strond (hereinafter called the Trinity House), and to fix that in respect of the said establishment the aggregate amount of the salaries which, under the provisions of the said Order in Council, should for the time being be paid to the officers of the said establishment, should be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund:

And whereas it is expedient that the engineering establishment by the said recited Order fixed to be maintained as aforesaid by the Trinity House on account of the services of lighthouses, buoys, and beacons, should be varied in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that such variation in the engineering establishment of the Trinity House mentioned
