HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine; and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-sixth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, in the words following, that is to say:

"Wc, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-nine and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-nine and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for making better provision for the cure of souls in the following cures, that is to say the new parish of Saint Barnabas Bethnal Green the new parish of Saint Paul Bethnal Green and the new parish of Christ Church George's in the East, all in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas the advowson of the rectory and parish church (hercinafter called 'the said benefice') of All Hallows Lombard-street with Saint Benet Gracechurch Saint Leonard Eastcheap and Saint Dionis Backchurch in the city of London and in the said diocese of London is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Metropolitical Church of Christ at Canterbury.

"And whereas the respective advowsons of the said cures of Saint Barnabas Bothnal Green Saint Paul Bethnal Green and Christ Church Saint George's in the East are vested in the Bishop of the said diocese of London and his

"And whereas it has been proposed to us by the said Dean and Chapter of the Metropolitical Church of Christ at Canterbury and by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Mandell Bishop of London that in order to render legally practicable an apportionment of the endowments of the said benefice of All Hallows Lombard-street with Saint Benet Gracechurch Saint Leonard Eastcheap and Saint Dionis Backchurch in favour of the three other benefices hereinbefore mentioned the transfer of patronage hereinafter recommended and proposed should be effected.

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Frederick Archbishop of Canterbury is consenting to the transfer of patronage hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed and in token of his consent thereto (which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned case made necessary) he the said. Archbishop has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas under the circumstances thus set forth it appears to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England that the transfer of the advowsons of the said three benefices which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parishes or districts in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists that is to say in the said new parish of Saint Barnabas Bethnal Green the said new parish of Saint Paul Bethnal Green and the said new parish of Christ Church Saint George's in the East.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Mandell Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the said Frederick Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowsons or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefices of Saint Barnabas Bethnal Green Saint Paul Bethnal Green and Christ Church Saint George's in the East now vested in him the said Mandell Bishop of London as such Bishop as aforesaid shall be transferred from him the said Bishop and from his successors Bishops of the said diocese of London and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be fully and freely exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of the Metropolitical Church of Christ at Canterbury and their successors for

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.
