The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight in the words following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty, chapter eighty-two, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Agatha, Landport, situate in Conway-street, Landport, within the limits of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of All Saints, Portsea, in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of All Saints, Portsea, and of the parish of Portsmouth, in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parish and of such parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of All Saints, Portsea, and of the said parish of Portsmouth should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Agatha, Landport, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Randall Thomas Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and caused his episcopal seal to be affixed to this representation) with the consent of the Reverend Cosmo Gordon Lang, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Vicar of Portsea, and as such vicar, the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of All Saints Portsea (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation) and with the consent of the Warden and Scholars Clerks of Saint Mary's College of Winchester in the said county of Southampton, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said parish of Portsmouth (in testimony whereof they have caused their common or corporate seal to be affixed to this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of All Saints, Portsea, and of the parish of Portsmouth aforesaid which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Agatha, Landport, situate as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Agatha, Landport.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The consolidated chapelry of Saint Agatha, Landport, comprising:—

"All that portion of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of All Saints, Portsea, and all that contiguous portion (being a detached portion) of the parish of Portsmouth both in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester which are together comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the new parish of Saint Luke, Portsea, in the said county and diocese from the new parish of All Saints, Portsea aforesaid at the junction of Arundel-street with Commercial-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thomas's-street and extending

thence westward along the middle of the lastnamed street for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the street called or known as Vicar-row and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its northern end at a point at the wall forming the southern boundary of the premises of the Royal Portsmouth Portsea and Gosport Hospital and extending thence westward along the said wall for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with the wall forming the western boundary of the same premises and extending thence northward along the last described wall for a distance of four chains or thereabouts (thereby passing along the eastern side of Clarence-street) to the northern end of the said last described wall at the point where Clarencestreet aforesaid Fitzherbert-street and Flathouseroad all jo n and extending thence westward and in a direct line across the last-named road to the wall forming the south-eastern boundary of the Royal Dockyard and extending thence southwestward along the last-mentioned wall for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts (thereby passing along the north-western side of the said Flathouse-road) to the point at the Unicorn-gate where the said Flathouse-road is joined by Unicorn-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the lastnamed road for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Edinburgh-road upon the said boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints, Portsea, from the new parish of Saint Luke, Portsea aforesaid, and extending thence for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts first south eas:ward and then · north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby first following the middle of the lastnamed road and then following the middle of Commercial-road aforesaid) to the firstly-mentioned point at the junction of the last-named road with Arundel-street aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced.'

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said J. H. Harrison. diocese of Winchester.

. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge, and of the new parish of Saint Stephen, Burnley, both in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the eighth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five and published in the London Gazette on the third day of September following a certain part of the parish of Whalley in the said county of Lancaster and at that time in the diocese of Chester but now in the diocese of Manchester aforesaid was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and was named 'The District of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the fourteenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one and published in the London Gazette on the ninth day of December following the boundaries of the said district of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge (at that time as now in the said diocese of Manchester) were altered and extended so as to include within such district certain portions of the township of

Burul-y.

"And whereas the said township of Burnley is within the original limits of the parochial chapelry

of Burnley.

And whereas the said district of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge, has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-

"And whereas by the authourity of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the fourteenth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and published in the London Gazette on the nineteenth day of the same month certain contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge, and of the said parochial chapelry of Burnley were assigned as a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Stephen situate at Burnley in the said new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge and the same consolidated chapelry was called 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Stephen, Burnley.

"And whereas under the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty and published in the London Gazette on the day following the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Paul,

Lane Bridge, were further altered

"And whereas the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Stephen, Burnley, has under the provisions of the said Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four also become a new parish.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Paul,

Lane Bridge, and of the said new parish of Saint | Liverpool Canal and extending thence north-Stephen, Burnley, should be altered so as to dissever from the said new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge, a certain portion thereof and to annex the same to the new parish of Saint

Stephen, Burnley aforesaid.

" Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners bumbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the Lordon Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge shall be altered so as to dissever therefrom all that portion thereof which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink and so as to include all that same portion within the limits of the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Burnley, and that from and after the same date and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said portion of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge, so to be dissevered therefrom as aforesaid shall become annexed to and become and be and shall together form part of the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Burnley.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of

Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Stephen, Burnley, in the said county and diocese,

being:

"All that portion of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge, which is bounded upon the north-east partly by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Catherine Burnley, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and partly by the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Burnley, upon the southeast by the last-named new parish, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say upon the southwest, and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Burnley, from the new parish of St. Paul, Lane Bridge, aforesaid, at the junction of Hufling-lane with Glebe-street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dall-street, and extending thence northwestward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Parliament-street and extending thence westward along the middle of the lastnamed street for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hollingreaveroad and with the roadway which connects the last-named road with the street or road called Finsley-gate, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said connecting roadway for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the same connecting roadway over the Leeds and I of Christ Church, Streatham, has under the

eastward to and along the middle of the said canal for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the centre of the aqueduct which carries the same canal over the River Culder which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint Paul, Lane Bridge, from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Catherine, Burnley

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or . representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation . has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

Number 29 Mark-lane in the parish of Saint Order shall have been duly published in the Olave Hart-street, Solicitor, William John Verry of Number 25 Savage-gardens aforesaid Builder, Robert Honey of Number 5 Trinity-square in the parish of Saint Olave Hart-street, Wine Cooper, James Innes of Numbers 26, 27 and 28 Mark-lane in the said parish Estate Agent and Harry John Newman M.A., of Number 27 Crutched-friars aforesaid Journalist as Trustees (hereinafter called the said Trustees).

"And whereas the respective advowsons of the said two cures (hereinafter referred to as the said benefices) of Saint Luke Homerton and Saint Thomas Arbour-square Stepney are vested in the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Mandell Bishop of the said diocese of London in right of his See.

"And whereas it has been proposed to us by the said Trustees and by the said Mandell Bishop of London that in order to render legally practicable an apportionment of the endowments of the said benefice of Saint Olave Hart-street with All Hallows Staining in favour of the two other benefices hereinbefore mentioned the transfer of patronage hereinafter recommended and proposed should be effected.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that such transfer of patronage as is herein. before mentioned is expedient and will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parishes or districts in or in respect of which the rights of patronage to be transferred respectively arise or exist that is to say in the said new parishes of Saint Luke Homerton and Saint Thomas Arbour-square, Stepney.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Mandell Bishop of London (in testimony of which consent he the said Bishop has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) and also with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Frederick Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony of which consent he the said Archbishop has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal) we the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowsons or perpetual rights of patronage of and presentation to the said benefices of Saint Luke Homerton and Saint Thomas Arbour-square Stepney respectively shall be transferred from the said Mandell Bishop of London in whom as such Bishop the same advowsons or perpetual rights of patronage and presentation are now vested as aforesaid and from his successors in the same bishoprick and shall thereupon become and be absolutely vested in the said Trustees and shall and may from time to time be fully and freely exercised by the said Trustees and their successors for ever.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the parish of Clee in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Clee which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner.

hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

And whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of Clee is a cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the in-

habitants thereof.

"And whereas certain well-disposed persons have contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of one thousand eight hundred pounds in aid of the endowment of the said proposed district and in respect of such sum we have undertaken to pay to the minister of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish then to the incumbent thereof, an annual payment of fifty-four pounds, so long as the said

capital sum shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said sum of one thousand eight hundred pounds has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners should out of the common fund created by the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act grant to the minister or incumbent of the said proposed district or new parish a capital sum of seven hundred pounds in respect of which there shall be paid by us to such minister or incumbent when duly licensed to such proposed district or new parish and to his or their successors, a yearly sum of twenty-one pounds.

"And whereas by a deed dated the twenty-sixth immediately from and after the time when this day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, operating under the New Parishes Acts and being under our Common Seal, the Reverend Henry Hutchinson, the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish of Clee aforesaid, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln, the patron and ordinary of the said parish of Clee, granted and confirmed to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish a clear annual rent charge of seventy-five pounds payable half yearly on the first day of February and on the first day of August in each and every year charged upon, and payable out of the tithe rent charge commuted at three hundred and twenty-seven pounds and six shillings belonging to the rectory of Clee afore-

"And whereas the said clear annual rent charge has been so granted and confirmed as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned to the said Edward Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln and to his successors Bishops of the same diocese for

"And whereas the said Edward Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln has been duly nominated to us as the patron of the said proposed district as

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Edward Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Clee which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Saints Grimsby.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edward Bishop of the diocese of Lincoln aforesaid and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parlia-

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Saints, Grimsby, being:-"All that part of the parish of Clee in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln which is bounded upon the north-east by the new

parish of Saint John the Evangelist New Clee upon the north-west and upon part of the west by the new parish of Saint Andrew Great Grimsby and upon the remaining part of the west by the parish of Great Grimsby all in the county and diocese aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say upon the south, upon the south-east and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said parish of Great Grimsby from the parish of Clee aforesaid crosses the middle of the Weelsby-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said road for a d stance of thirty-three chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the East Lincolnshire Line of the Great Northern Railway) to the junction of the same road with Heneage-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Torrington-street and extending. thence north-eastward and in a straight line drawn in direct continuation of the line of the middle of the last-named street for a distance of twentythree chains or thereabouts (thereby following the intended course of the future continuation of the same street) to a point in the middle of Weelsby drain and extending thence first northwestward then northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the said drain for a distance of fifty-six chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Clee from the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist New Clee aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the cure out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln. (a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brick-

work properly cemented.

remains.

STOTFOLD, BEDFORDSHIRE.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Stotfold

in the county of Bedford; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, at a minimum depth of two feet below the surface of the soil.

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing in the churchyard or in the additional churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented (at a minimum depth of two feet).

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard or in the additional churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those

interred therein at the date of the Order viz.: widows and widowers as can be buried

at or below that depth.

OTHERY, SOMERSET. - Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Othery in the county of Somerset; and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine except :-

In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brick-

work properly cemented.

SNODLAND, KENT. - Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Snodland in the county of Kent; and also in the churchyard, except

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brick-

work properly cemented.

(b.) In earthen graves now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed of the relatives of those interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or

disturbing human remains: and

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in which when opened are free from water burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

COOKHAM, BERKSHIRE. - Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Cookham in the county of Berks; and also in the churchyard after the thirtieth June one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine except as follows:-

(a.) In vaults and wholly walled graves now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin be separately enclosed by stone work or brick-

work properly cemented.

(b.) In partly walled and earthen graves now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed of the relatives of those already interred therein provided the bodies can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

"No. 1.-West Ward. "I do hereby determine that West Ward shall centre of the Promenade to the Marine Drive, No. 26989.

comprise so much of the said borough of Southport as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point on the foreshore at the intersection of the north-western and southwestern boundaries of the said borough, such point of intersection being situate six thousand five hundred and thirty-six lineal yards or thereabouts from the centre of Rotten-row measured in a north-westerly direction along the boundary of the borough, thence in a south-easterly direction along the said south-western boundary of the borough to the intersection of the centre of Mosleystreet, thence north-easterly along the centre of Mosley-street to the centre of Boundary-street, thence south-easterly along the centre of Boundary-street to the centre of Sefton-street, thence north-easterly along the centre of Sefton-street, to the centre of Portland-street, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centres of Portland-street and Coronation-walk respectively and forward in a north-westerly direction parallel to the borough boundary for a distance of six thousand four hundred lineal yards or thereabouts from the centre of the Promenade to the north-western boundary of the borough, and thence in a south-westerly direction along such north-western boundary for a distance of five hundred and twenty lineal yards or thereabouts to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that South Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough of Southport as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at the intersection of the centre of Mosley-street and the south-western boundary of the said borough, thence in a south-easterly direction along the said south-western boundary to the southern boundary of the borough, thence in an easterly, south-easterly, and north-easterly direction, respectively, along the southern boundary of the borough to its intersection with the centre of Scarisbrick New-road, thence northwesterly along the centre of Scarisbrick Newroad to the centre of Hampton-road, thence southwesterly along the centre of Hampton road to the centre of Portland-street, thence north-westerly along the centre of Portland-street to the centre of Sefton-street, thence south-westerly along the centre of Sefton-street to the centre of Boundarystreet, thence north-westerly along the centre of Boundary-street to the centre of Mosley-street. thence south-westerly along the centre of Mosleystreet to the point of commencement aforesaid.

'No. 3.—Central Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Central Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough of Southport as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point on the foreshore at the intersection of the north-eastern boundary of West Ward and the north-western boundary of the borough, six thousand four hundred lineal yards or thereabouts from the centre of the promenade, thence along such north-eastern boundary of West Ward (ie, the foreshore, Coronation Walk, and Portland-street respectively), in a south-easterly direction to the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, thence in a north-easterly direction along the south-eastern boundary of such railway to Eastbank-street, and forward in an easterly direction along the southern boundary of such railway to the Victoria Footbridge, thence northward along the east side of the Victoria Footbridge to a point opposite to the centre of London-street, thence north-westerly along the Railway Company's yard and the centre of London-street and Nevill-street to the Promenade, thence north-easterly along the thence north-westerly along the north-eastern side of the Marine Drive for a distance of about five hundred and seventy lineal yards to the bend in the Marine Drive, thence north-westerly along the foreshore in a direction parallel with the south-western boundary of the Ward, for a distance of five thousand six hundred and eighty lineal yards or thereabouts, to the north-western boundary of the borough, thence south-westerly along such boundary for a distance of three hundred and forty yards or thereabouts to the point of commencement aforesaid.

#### "No. 4.- Craven Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Craven Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough of Southport as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point at the intersection of the south-eastern boundary of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway and the centre of Portlandstreet, thence south-easterly along the centre of Pertland-street to the centre of Hampton-road, thence north-easterly along the centre of Hamptonroad to the centre of Scarisbrick New-road, thence south-easterly along the centre of Scarisbrick New-road to the south-eastern boundary of the borough, thence following the course of Boundary Brook in a north-easterly direction along the said south-easterly boundary of the borough to the Lancasbire and Yorkshire Railway, thence northwesterly along the south-west boundary of such railway to the centre of Hampton-road, and forward west and south-west respectively, along the south-west boundary of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway in the direction of Birkdale to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" No. 5. - Marine Ward.

#### ORKNEY SARCOPTIC MANGE ORDER OF 1898.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, have hereunto set their Official Seal this I do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Regulations of Local Authority of Orkney as to Movement of Animals, Fodder &c.

1. The Local Authority of the county of Orkney may make such Regulations as they think fit for the following purposes, or any of them:

(a.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement into or out of any shed, stable, building, field, or other place, or any part thereof, of any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of sarcoptic mange;

(b.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement of any horse, ass, or mule into or out of any shed, stable, building, field, or other place, or any part thereof, in which there is or has been any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of sarcoptic mange; and

(c.) For regulating the removal out of any shed, stable, building, field, or other place of any fodder, litter, or other thing that has been in contact with or used for or about any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of

sarcoptic mange;

but nothing in any such Regulation shall authorize movement in contravention of any provision of any Order of the Board for the time being in force; and a Regulation under paragraph (b) of this Article shall operate so long only as any horse, ass, or mule which in the judgment of the Local Authority is affected with or suspected of sarcoptic mange remains in the shed, stable, building, field. or other place to which the Regulation refers, and until the shed, stable, building, field, or other place has been cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Local Authority.

Slaughter and Compensation.

2. The Local Authority of the county of Orkney may, with the special authority of the Board of Agriculture, cause to be slaughtered any horse, ass, or mule which in the judgment of the Local Authority is affected with sarcoptic mange, and in any such case shall, out of the local rate, pay as compensation the value of the horse, ass, or mule immediately before it was slaughtered.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

3. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and sarcoptic mange shall be a disease, for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):

Sections nineteen and twenty (slaughter and

compensation);

Section forty-three (powers of police); Section forty-four (powers of inspectors); and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

Offences.

4. If a horse, ass, or mule or any thing is moved in contravention of any Regulation made by the Local Authority of the county of Orkney under this Order, the owner of the animal or thing, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal or thing, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal or thing is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

## Interpretation.

5. In this Order-

- "Fodder" means hay or other substance commonly used for food of horses, asses, or mules :
- "Litter" means straw or other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about horses, asses, or mules:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation of Order.

6. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Order hereby revoked, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this

Extent.

7. This Order extends to the county of Orkney only.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
