The Companies Acts, 1862 to 1890.
Special Resolution (pursuant to the Companies Act, 1862, sections 50 and 51, or whatever other sections apply) of the Burnham Syndicate, Limited. Passed July 5th, 1898; confirmed July 22nd, 1898.

At an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Members of the above-named Company, duly convened, and held at Billiter-buildings, Billiter-street, in the city of London, on the 5th day of July, 1898, the following Special Resolution was duly passed; and at a subsequent Extra-

ordinary General Meeting of the Members of the said Company, also duly convened, and held at the same place on the 22nd day of July, 1898 the following Special Resolution was duly confirmed :—

“That this Company be wound up voluntarily, and that Richard Rabbidge, of 32, Poultry, E.C., Chartered Accountant, be and is hereby appointed Liquidator to conduct the winding-up, at a fee of £52 10s.”
