Application of Swine-Fever (Movement) Order of 1898.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the part of the District of the Local Authority mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be subject to the Swine-Fever (Movement) Order of 1898 and the provisions of such Order shall apply thereto accordingly:

Provided that any part of the said District which for the time being is declared by Special Order of the Board of Agriculture to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area shall not be subject to the Swine-Fever (Movement) Order of 1898.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
