THE Chilean Government has given notice that it is intended shortly to establish a light of the 6th order on Delgada Point.

Delgada Point Light will show a white occulting light with eclipses of five seconds duration every ten seconds, elevated 30 feet above high water, 20 feet above the ground, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles from N.  $22^{\circ}$  E., through north, to S.  $20^{\circ}$  E.

##### *Berehaven—Character and Position of Buoys, Wreck Removed.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners Nos. 402 and 589 of 1897:—

The following information, dated 16th July, 1898, respecting the buoys in Berehaven, has been received from Lieutenant L. G. S. Hancock, Her Majesty's ship "Onyx":—

Harbour Rock Buoy, a spherical buoy with black and white horizontal stripes, marked "Harbour Rock," is now moored in 37 feet low-water springs, with Dunboy Castle (ruin) bearing N.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W., distant  $3\frac{1}{2}$  cables, and the north extreme of Fort Point, N.E. by E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E.

Walter Scott Rock Buoy is marked "Walter Scott Rock," and is moored in 34 feet low-water springs; position unchanged.

Volage Buoy is not marked, and is moored in 36 feet low-water springs; position unchanged.

Hornet Rock Buoy.—The character has been altered from a black conical to a black and white chequered can buoy moored in 42 feet; position unchanged.
