HER Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a Despatch from the Acting British Consul at Buenos Ayres, stating that, in consequence of the stringent regulations now in force in the Argentine Republic with regard to the Enrolment of the National Guard, British subjects, who are unable at short notice to furnish proof of their place of birth, are liable to be subjected to some inconvenience. It is desirable, therefore, that British subjects who intend to proceed to the Argentine Republic should provide themselves with birth certificates or other satisfactory evidence of their nationality and birth-place, and that they should apply to Her Majesty's Consul at Buenos Ayres for a Protection Paper on their arrival in the Country.

Weymouth Point—Shoal Extending.

INFORMATION, dated 20th July, 1898, has been received from Lieutenant and Commander A. H. Williamson, Her Majesty's ship "Columbine," that the shoal off Weymouth Point now extends about three cables from that point, From

its outer extremity the north extreme of Adamson Point bears N. 69° E., distant eight cables, and the south extreme of Drummond Island N. 13° W.

Amherst Point—Light Exhibited.

Amherst Point Light is a sixth order, dioptric, fixed red light, elevated 68 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather a distance of 8 miles, between the bearings of N.N.E. through East and S.E.

Ibo Harbour—Alteration in Buoyage.

THE Portuguese Government has given notice, dated 19th July, 1898, that the following alteration has been made in the buoyage of Ibo Harbour:—

The black buoy on the southern edge of Corea de S. Gonsalo has been replaced by a spherical buoy painted in red and white horizontal bands.

Approximate position, lat. 12° 17' S., long. 40° 37 $\frac{1}{4}$ ' E.

The two red buoys on the northern side of Mujaca Shoal have been replaced by two black cylindrical buoys placed on the two projecting points of the reef.

A black spherical buoy, placed inside the harbour, marks the southern limit of the anchorage.

These buoys are moored in 4 fathoms at low water, and may be passed at a convenient distance, but vessels should not go to the southward of the buoy marking the anchorage.

The black buoy marking the east end of Corea de S. Gonsalo, and the mooring buoy in the anchorage, have been removed from the Charts.

Saltholm Flat—Submarine Mining Practice Ground.

THE Danish Government has given notice that from 30th August to 24th September, 1898, an area on Saltholm Flat will be appropriated for submarine mining. It will be marked in the following manner:—

On the west side by a light-vessel painted green with green flag, showing at night a red light over a green light, moored with Middelgrund Fort Lighthouse bearing W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., distant about 1 $\frac{1}{10}$ miles.

The south-west extremity by a green buoy with green cage and ball, moored with Middelgrund Fort Lighthouse bearing W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., distant 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

The south-east extremity by a green buoy with green cage and ball, moored with Middelgrund Fort Lighthouse bearing W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., distant 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

Three small green buoys with green flags will also be placed on the north side, one on the west side, and two on the other sides.

The light-vessel to the north-eastward will, during thick or foggy weather, ring a bell, finishing with a double stroke; that to the westward will also ring a bell, concluding with a single stroke.

Mariners are warned not to navigate within the area thus marked.

Sumulata—Reefs to the Eastward.

Position of Kwangdang Bay.

THE Netherlands Government has given notice, dated 5th August, 1898, of the existence of the following reefs:—
